INFORMATION ON CIVIL SUITS INVOLVING TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLE (TxDMV) FOR COURT ORDERED TITLE CHANGES AND VIN ASSIGNMENTS

Individuals requesting the court to order the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles (TxDMV) to issue a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) and/or a Certificate of Title need to provide some documents to the court showing the purchase of said vehicle and proof of a 68a Vehicle Inspection.

Walker County is part of the Auto Theft Task Force that conducts 68a vehicle inspections for citizens in 8 county area of coverage. An Auto Theft Investigator is the only person who can conduct these inspections. FILING A CIVIL SUIT FOR VIN AND/OR TITLE:

- ❖ **Step 1** determine which of the petitions to be used:
 - ➤ if you need a VIN <u>AND</u> a title, use *Petition VIN Assignment* and *Order VIN Assignment*
 - ➤ if you <u>ONLY</u> need a title, use *Petition Title Only* and *Order Title Only*
- ❖ Step 2 complete the petition and attach the proof of purchase and 68a inspection. Complete the order.
- ❖ Step 3 file the petition and order with the County Clerk, paying the applicable fees.
- ❖ Step 4 send a file-stamped copy of the petition to the defendant, which should be the person from whom you purchased the vehicle, <u>and</u> TxDMV by facsimile at 512-465-5638 or by mail at: Associate General Counsel, Office of General Counsel, Texas Department of Motor Vehicles, 4000 Jackson Avenue, Austin, Texas 78731.
- ❖ Step 5 upon the judge's ruling and signature of the court order, send a file-stamped copy to TxDMV at the facsimile or mailing address in the bullet point above. The TxDMV will comply with the order.
- ❖ Step 6 present the signed order to the Tax Assessor-Collector's office.
