We wish to thank you and the other community officials for your cooperation given to our representative. ISO is the leading supplier of statistical, underwriting and actuarial information for the property/casualty insurance industry. Most insurers use the PPC classifications for underwriting and calculating premiums for residential, commercial and industrial properties.

ISO has completed its analysis of the structure fire suppression delivery system provided in your community. We would like to report that ISO has recommended a classification of **09/10** to the Texas Department of Insurance/State Fire Marshal's Office. Congratulations on this recognition of your commitment to serve the needs of your community's property owners and residents.

Please note that this classification is not effective until the official letter is received from the Texas Department of Insurance/State Fire Marshal's Office listing the approved effective date.

Below is a summary of the ISO analysis of your fire suppression services.

As a reminder, through ongoing research and loss experience analysis, we identified additional differentiation in fire loss experience within our PPC program, which resulted in the revised classifications. We based the differing fire loss experience on the fire suppression capabilities of each community. The new classifications will improve the predictive value for insurers while benefiting both commercial and residential property owners. We've published the new classifications as "X" and "Y" – formerly the "9" and "8B" portion of the split classification, respectively. For example:

- A community currently graded as a split 6/9 classification will now be a split 6/6X classification; with the "6X" denoting what was formerly classified as "9."
 - Similarly, a community currently graded as a split 6/8B classification will now be a split 6/6Y classification, the "6Y" denoting what was formerly classified as "8B."
 - Communities graded with single "9" or "8B" classifications will remain intact.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION CONTRACT
BETWEEN
THE TEXAS COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS
AND
WALKER COUNTY, TEXAS

I. Parties

Under the statutory authority of Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, this interlocal cooperation contract (Contract) is entered into by and between the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts (Grantee) and Walker County, Texas (Service Provider) in aid of Justice Assistance Grant No. 1491822: “Prosecution of Prison Crimes” (Grant).

II. Governing Laws, Record Retention, and Audit

- a. Governing Laws.** Service Provider must comply with all applicable state, federal, and local laws, regulations, and ordinances, including the *Uniform Grant Management Standards* (UGMS), relevant OMB Circulars while in effect and the *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (2 C.F.R. Part 200), and Criminal Justice Division administrative rules regarding grants (1 TEX ADMIN. CODE §§ 3.1–3.2603).
- b. Record Retention and Inspection.** Service Provider will establish and keep a set of records that comply with the requirements of the Grant. Service Provider must retain all records for at least four (4) years following closure of the most recent audit report and until any outstanding litigation, audit, claim, or billing issue has been resolved. All records are subject to inspection by the Grantee, the Criminal Justice Division, or any state or federal agency authorized to inspect the records.
- c. Right to Audit.** Pursuant to Section 2262.154, Texas Government Code, the state auditor may conduct an audit or investigation of Service Provider or any other entity or person receiving funds from the state directly under this Contract or indirectly through a subcontract under this Contract. The acceptance of funds by Service Provider or any other entity or person directly under this Contract or indirectly through a subcontract under this Contract acts as acceptance of the authority of the state auditor, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. Under the direction of the legislative audit committee, the Service Provider or other entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation by the state auditor must provide the state auditor with access to any information the state auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit. This Contract may be amended unilaterally by Grantee to comply with any rules and procedures of the state auditor in the implementation and enforcement of Section 2262.154, Texas Government Code. Service Provider shall ensure that this paragraph concerning the authority to audit funds received indirectly by subcontractors through the Service Provider and the requirement to cooperate is included in any subcontract it awards.

III. Statement of Services and Roles and Responsibilities

- a.** Service Provider will comply with the terms of the Grant, which is incorporated by reference into this

Contract. Service Provider will perform the services and projects detailed in the Grant.

b. Special Prosecution Unit Roles and Responsibilities

- i. The parties understand that the prosecutors, investigators, legal assistants, and support staff of the Special Prosecution Unit will assist various elected prosecutors throughout the state. When acting in Walker County, Texas, these staff members are under the sole control and direction of the Criminal District Attorney of Walker County, Texas; when acting in another county, they are under the sole control of the District Attorney or County Attorney, as the case may be, for whom they are providing the requested technical assistance.
- ii. Both parties understand that Service Provider has no control over the actions of the prosecutors, investigators, legal assistants, and support staff in the legal discharge of their duties and has no other obligation under this Contract except those provisions outlined in this Contract. Both parties understand that Article V, Section 21, of the Texas Constitution gives the elected prosecutor the sole and exclusive control of all criminal cases in his or her jurisdiction. Moreover, Service Provider recognizes and understands that it also claims no right to control the elected prosecutor's right to dispose of criminal cases.

IV. Contract Amount, Payment Terms, and Funding

- a. The amount of this Contract will not exceed **ONE MILLION, FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED FOURTY TWO AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$1,520,542.00)** for the term of the Contract. More detailed information is set out in Attachment A, "Budget Details Information."
/
- b. Grantee will reimburse Service Provider on a monthly basis within thirty (30) days of invoice receipt for all actual costs incurred by the Service Provider for the operation of the Grant. Costs for the performance of this contract include the amounts set out in the "Personnel" category of the Grant for the following:
 - i. salaries and fringe benefits for Prosecutors, Investigators and Support Staff of the Special Prosecution Unit; and
 - ii. necessary capital and operating expenses and administrative fees that are essential for the Special Prosecution Unit's staff to investigate and prosecute crimes that occur in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.
- c. Service Provider must submit invoices that include an invoice number, the reimbursement amount, date range for the period the service was provided, and budget category. The invoice must include a summary of the expenses for actual and allowable expenses that: (1) conform to the Grant; and (2) that Service Provider incurs on behalf of the Special Prosecution Unit. Grantee may require additional documentation to support payment and Service Provider shall promptly respond to such requests.
- d. The parties understand that payment obligations created by this Contract are conditional upon the availability of specifically appropriated state or federal funds allocated for payment of these obligations. Both parties' authority and appropriations are subject to actions of the Texas Legislature. If either party becomes subject to a legislative change, revocation of statutory

authority, or lack of appropriated funds that would render either party's delivery or performance under the Contract impossible or unnecessary, the Contract will be terminated or cancelled and be deemed null and void. In the event of a termination or cancellation under this section, neither party will be liable to the other for any damages caused or associated with that termination or cancellation. The party terminating or cancelling under this section is not required to provide advance notice.

- e. In the event that the federal government recoups money from the state for expenses or costs that are deemed unallowable by the federal government, the Grantee has the right to, in turn, recoup payments made to Service Provider for these same expenses or costs. If the Grantee retroactively recoups money due to a federal disallowance, the Grantee will recoup the entire amount paid to Service Provider for the federally disallowed expenses or costs, not just the federal portion.
- f. Dependent upon the facts and whether there is any unfavorable audit or disallowance by a federal entity, Service Provider may or may not be entitled to recover for all services provided or materials delivered prior to a termination under Section VIII.
- g. Service Provider must provide all billed services within the Contract term.

V. Licensure Requirements

Service Provider must have all licenses, legal certificates, or inspections required for all applicable services, facilities, equipment, or materials. Grantee will consider failure to comply with this clause a material breach of the Contract.

VI. Monitoring and Grantee Evaluation Reporting

Grantee will closely monitor the Service Provider to enforce all terms and conditions of the Grant and Contract. Service Provider agrees to cooperate fully in this monitoring process.

- a. **Grantee Evaluation Reporting.** Service Provider acknowledges that, as a condition of receiving the Grant, Grantee is required by the Office of the Governor to comply with evaluation reporting requirements and procedures ("Grantee Evaluation Reporting"). Service Provider agrees to cooperate fully with Grant Evaluation Reporting and provide Grantee with any information and/or data, as applicable, requested by Grantee in order to comply with Grantee Evaluation Reporting in a timely manner.

VII. Contract Term

The Contract term is coterminous with the Grant term, which is effective on September 1, 2022, and ends on August 31, 2023, unless extended or terminated.

VIII. Termination

This Contract will terminate on the Grant expiration date, unless the Grant is extended or terminated. The Contract may also be terminated for any of the following reasons.

- a. **Termination by mutual agreement.** The parties may mutually agree to terminate this Contract.
- b. **Termination for convenience.** Grantee may terminate the Contract without cause at any time when, in its sole discretion, it determines that termination is in the best interest of the State of Texas. Grantee will provide reasonable advance written notice of the termination, as it deems

appropriate under the circumstances. The termination will be effective on the date specified in the notice of termination.

- c. **Termination for Cause.** In the event of a material breach of the Contract, such as a default, by Service Provider, Grantee may cancel or suspend the Contract. Also, Grantee may terminate this Contract if a violation or failure to adhere to laws, rules, or ordinances prevents or substantially impairs performance of duties under this Contract. The termination will be effective on the date specified in the notice of termination.

IX. Dispute Resolution

- a. The parties agree to use good-faith efforts to resolve all questions, difficulties, or disputes of any nature that may arise under this Contract; however, nothing in this Contract will preclude either party from pursuing any remedies available under Texas law.
- b. If the parties cannot resolve the dispute by good-faith efforts, Chapter 2009 of the Texas Government Code, Alternative Dispute Resolution for Use by Governmental Bodies will govern the dispute as well as any applicable Model Rules promulgated by the Office of the Attorney General or the State Office of Administrative Hearings of the State of Texas.

X. Debts or Delinquencies to the State

- a. The Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that any obligation to refund or return contract funds based on termination or breach of this Contract entered into by the Service Provider and Grantee creates “a debt to the state” for purposes of Section 403.055 of the Texas Government Code. The Service Provider further acknowledges and agrees that the terms of this Contract are sufficient to create a debt by agreement between the Service Provider and Grantee. Grantee agrees that it shall provide the Service Provider the opportunity to contest the amount due or the existence of a breach through an internal administrative review process which shall be determined by Grantee. The Service Provider’s failure to return any amount owed upon conclusion of Grantee’s administrative review process shall allow Grantee to use the warrant-hold process under Section 403.055 of the Texas Government Code as a means of enforcing the Service Provider’s compliance with the terms of this Contract or to recover grant funds required to be returned by the Service Provider under the terms of this Contract.
- b. If the Service Provider is a “local government entity” as defined under Section 271.151 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that this Contract is a written contract stating the essential terms for providing services to the Service Provider, and therefore, this Contract is subject to Chapter 271, Subchapter I, of the Local Government Code, which waives sovereign immunity for certain breach of contract claims.

XI. Force Majeure

Neither party is liable to the other for any delay in, or failure of performance of, any requirement included in this Contract caused by force majeure. The existence of these causes of delay or failure extends the period of performance until after the causes of delay or failure have been removed provided the non-performing party exercises all reasonable due diligence to perform. Force majeure is defined as acts of God, war, fires, explosions, hurricanes, floods, failure of transportation, or other causes that are beyond the reasonable control of either party and that, by exercise of due foresight, a party could not reasonably have been expected to avoid, and which, by the exercise of all reasonable due diligence, a party is unable to overcome.

XII. No Waiver of Rights or Immunities

This Contract will not constitute or be construed as a waiver of any of the privileges, rights, defenses, remedies, or immunities available to Grantee as an agency of the State of Texas, or otherwise available to Grantee. The failure to enforce or any delay in the enforcement of any privileges, rights, defenses, remedies, or immunities available to Grantee under this Contract or under applicable law does not constitute a waiver of those privileges, rights, defenses, remedies, or immunities or be considered as a basis for estoppel. Grantee does not waive any privileges, rights, defenses, or immunities available to it as an agency of the State of Texas or otherwise available to it, by entering into this Contract or by its conduct prior to or subsequent to entering into this Contract.

XIII. Severability

If one or more provisions are deemed invalid, illegal, or unenforceable for any reason, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision and this Contract shall be construed as if the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

XIV. Subcontracting and Assignment

- a. Subcontracting.** Prior to subcontracting any services that Service Provider will provide under this Contract or entering into a Cooperative Work Agreement (CWA), Service Provider must notify Grantee of the proposed subcontract or CWA and obtain Grantee’s written approval of any subcontract or CWA. Prior to amending, modifying, or otherwise supplementing any subcontract or CWA relating to the services to be provided under this Contract, Service Provider must notify Grantee through the Texas online eGrants Application system of the proposed amendment, modification, or supplement and must obtain Grantee’s approval via eGrants certification. Service Provider, in subcontracting any of its performance under this Contract, must legally bind subcontractors or any party to a CWA to perform and, to the extent applicable, make these subcontractors or any party to a CWA subject to the duties, requirements, and obligations of Service Provider under this Contract, including any funding requirements or claw-back provisions. Service Provider is responsible for the work and activities of each subcontractor, including compliance with the terms of this Contract. Service Provider is responsible for all payments to its subcontractors.
- b. Sole Contact.** Regardless of any subcontracting, Service Provider will be the sole contact for Grantee.
- c. Assignment.** Service Provider may not assign its interests in or duties or rights under this Contract to another party.

XV. Attachments and Incorporations by Reference

- a.** Attachment A, “Budget Details Information” is attached and incorporated by this reference.
- b.** The Grant application as approved by the Governor’s Criminal Justice Division and located on the Texas Online eGrants Application system is also incorporated by this reference.

XVI. Certification

The parties certify that:

- a.** the services specified in this Contract are necessary and essential for activities that are properly within the statutory functions and programs of the parties; and
- b.** the proposed arrangements serve the interest of efficient, effective, and economical

administration of state government.

XVII. Contact Information

The Parties will maintain specifically identified liaison personnel for their mutual benefit during the term of the Contract for day-to-day communications. The Project Managers for this Contract are designated in this section. Subsequent changes to the Project Managers shall be communicated by the respective Parties in writing.

Texas Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) Grant Program

The Texas LEPC Grant Program is an opportunity for LEPCs to receive grant funds to help implement the requirements of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA).

The Texas Legislature transferred the Tier II Chemical Reporting Program to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) from the Texas Department of State Health Services in the 84th Texas Legislative Session. The statutory requirements for the Tier II Chemical Reporting Program can be found in the Texas Health and Safety Code 505.016(d), 506.017(d), and 507.013(d). These chapters authorize up to 20% of chemical reporting fees to be awarded as grants to the LEPCs to assist them in fulfilling their responsibilities under the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA).

Eligibility and Award Amounts

The funds for the Texas LEPC Grant Program are appropriated to the TCEQ by the Legislature and are subject to change annually. This grant round is up to \$420,000 total for all awards. Applications requesting a total of less than \$10,000 will not be considered. Priority will be given to first time grantees and to LEPCs with fewer than 250 facilities.

This grant will allow LEPCs to establish, maintain, and/or improve their implementation of EPCRA. Only LEPCs that are officially recognized by the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) are eligible for this grant.

Timeline and Deadlines

- A. The application deadline is December 2, 2022.
- B. Grant Contracts will be sent out for signature to applicants who receive awards. A signed contract must be returned to the TCEQ within 30 days.
- C. Submit initial Financial Status Report (FSR) to allow upfront funding within 30 days of receiving your notice to proceed email.
- D. Quarterly Reports must be completed for each of the reporting periods specified below. The first quarterly report will have the same effective date as the contract, but match the end date of the applicable quarter. For example, if your contract is effective on March 25, your first quarterly report will be from March 25 to May 31 and be due on June 15.
- E. **Quarterly Financial Status Report for March 1 to May 31** – Due by June 15
- F. **Quarterly Financial Status Report for June 1 to August 31** – Due by September 15

G. **Quarterly Financial Status Report for September 1 to November 30** – Due by December 15

H. **Quarterly Financial Status Report for December 1 to February 28/29** – Due by March 15

I. Purchasing deadline: by August 31, 2024

J. Contract Extension Requests Due: by July 1, 2024

K. Contract End Date: August 31, 2024

The only purchases that are not allowed are food, drinks, alcohol, and grant preparation services. All grant activities must take place within the grant award contract period.

Reporting Requirements**Q: What are the reporting requirements for this grant?**

A: A Request for Reimbursement (RFR) and Financial Status Report (FSR) with all supporting documentation (i.e. receipts, training certificates, invoices, etc.) must be periodically submitted, in writing, to the TCEQ grant coordinator. The initial frequency of reports will be monthly, then shall decrease to quarterly upon authorization of the TCEQ. A final RFR and FSR will be due within 45 days after the expiration of the contract. If advanced funds are approved, then only the FSR and supporting documentation will be required to document expenditures.




Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act

The goal of the 1986 [Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act \(EPCRA\)](#) is to prepare communities for and protect communities from chemical accidents. To ensure these goals are achieved, Section 301 of EPCRA required the creation of State Emergency Response Commissions (SERCs), Tribal Emergency Response Commissions (TERCs), Tribal Emergency Planning Committees (TEPCs), and Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs). These groups share responsibility for developing and implementing emergency response plans and providing residents with information on the presence and releases of hazardous chemicals reported by facilities in each community. EPCRA has four major focus areas:

Sections 302 to 303 focus on emergency planning. Section 302 requires notification when Extremely Hazardous Substances (EHSs) are present at facilities in quantities at or above the Threshold Planning Quantity (TPQ) established in the EPCRA regulations. Section 303 requires LEPCs and TEPCs to develop initial emergency response plans and update them annually and outlines the required elements of the plans.

Sections 311 and 312 focus on hazardous chemical storage reporting requirements. Section 311 requires facilities to submit a Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) (Safety Data Sheet (SDS)) to the SERC (or TERC), LEPC (or TEPC) and local fire departments for each hazardous chemical (as defined by the Occupational Health and Safety Act) that they handle or store. Section 312 requires the same facilities to submit a Tier I or Tier II hazardous chemical inventory form to the SERC (or TERC), LEPC (or TEPC) and local fire department. These forms identify the amount, location and potential hazards of each chemical on site at the facility at any point during the year.



Section 304 requires notification of accidental chemical releases. It requires facilities to immediately report accidental releases of certain chemicals to state, tribal and local authorities. Facilities must immediately report accidental releases of EHSs and “hazardous substances” defined under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA). Any releases of these substances that meet or exceed their corresponding Reportable Quantities (RQs) must be reported to their SERC (or TERC) and LEPC (or TEPC). Facilities are also required to submit a written follow-up report of these releases to these officials.

Section 313 established the Toxics Release Inventory (TRI). The TRI is a publicly available database that contains information on the quantities of certain toxic chemicals released annually to air, water and land, or otherwise managed as waste by industrial and federal facilities throughout the United States.

The information facilities submit is compiled in the TRI and made publicly available through online tools, written analyses, and interactive charts and maps. The information is always available and always free, and helps support informed decision-making by communities, government agencies, companies, and others.

Guide to the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act

On December 4, 1984, methyl isocyanate—an extremely toxic chemical—escaped from a Union Carbide chemical plant in Bhopal, India. Thousands of people died that night in what is widely considered to be the worst industrial disaster in history. Thousands more died later as a result of their exposure, and survivors continue to suffer with permanent disabilities. Six months later, a serious chemical release occurred at a similar facility in Institute, West Virginia; six people were hospitalized.

These two events raised concern about local preparedness for chemical emergencies and the availability of information on hazardous chemicals, and underscored growing demands by citizens, public interest groups and environmental organizations for information on the toxic chemicals routinely used and released by facilities in their communities.

In response, Congress passed the **Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA)** on **October 17, 1986**. EPCRA established requirements for federal, state and local governments; Indian tribes; and industrial facilities regarding emergency planning and “community right-to-know” reporting on hazardous and toxic chemicals. On October 23, 2018, the passage of America’s Water Infrastructure Act (AWIA) created additional responsibilities for state, tribal and local governments.

EPCRA’s emergency planning provisions help communities prepare for potential chemical accidents. EPCRA’s right-to-know provisions help increase public knowledge of and access to information on the presence, use, and release of chemicals at individual facilities. States, tribes and communities, working with facilities, can use the information to improve chemical safety and protect public health and the environment.

What are SERCs, TERCs, TEPCs and LEPCs?¹



State Emergency Response Commissions (SERCs)

Shortly after EPCRA was passed, the Governor of each state created a State Emergency Response Commission (SERC). The SERCs are responsible for designating local emergency planning districts and appointing Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) for each district. Each SERC supervises and coordinates the activities of their respective LEPCs, establishes procedures for receiving and processing public requests for information collected under EPCRA, and reviews local emergency response plans.

Tribal Emergency Response Commissions (TERCs)

The Chief Executive Office of the Tribe appoints the Tribal Emergency Response Commissions (TERCs). TERCs have the same responsibilities as SERCs. Tribal Emergency Planning Committees (TEPCs), established by the TERCs, have the same responsibilities as LEPCs.

Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) and Tribal Emergency Planning Committees (TEPCs)


Nationwide, there are 3500 LEPCs. LEPC and TEPC members must include, at a minimum, local officials (including police, fire, civil defense, public health, transportation, and environmental professionals), as well as representatives of facilities subject to the emergency planning requirements, community groups, and the media. Each LEPC and TEPC must develop an emergency response plan, review them at least annually, and provide the public with information about chemicals present in the community.

¹ SERCs, TERCs, TEPCs and LEPCs were established under EPCRA section 301.

What EPCRA Covers

EPCRA has four major provisions:

- Emergency Planning Notification and Emergency Response Plans (Sections 302-303)
- Emergency Release Notification (Section 304)
- Hazardous Chemical Inventory Reporting (Sections 311-312)
- Toxic Chemical Release Inventory (referred to as the “Toxics Release Inventory”) (Section 313)



Information collected under these sections helps states, tribes, and communities understand existing chemical hazards in communities, as well as at individual facilities.

Regulations implementing EPCRA are codified in Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations, parts 350 to 372.

Emergency Planning Notification and Emergency Response Plans (Sections 302-303)

As required by Section 302, within 30 days after the enactment, EPA published the list of Extremely Hazardous Substances (EHSs) and their Threshold Planning Quantities (TPQs) in an interim final rule. In April 1987, the list of EHSs and their TPQs was finalized. Within seven months of the enactment, facilities were required to notify the SERC (or TERC) and LEPC (or TEPC) if any EHS at or above its TPQ was present on site or within 60 days of first shipment or production of the substance on site.

EPCRA Section 303(d) requires facilities to notify the LEPC (or TEPC) of a facility representative who will participate in the emergency planning process as a facility emergency coordinator. Additionally, facilities are required to promptly provide any information necessary to develop and modify the emergency plan, upon request by the LEPC (or TEPC).

Emergency response plans contain information that community officials can use at the time of a chemical accident. Community emergency response plans for chemical accidents were developed under Section 303. LEPCs and TEPCs are required to update these plans annually. The plans must:

- Identify facilities with EHSs on site at or above the TPQs, routes likely to be used to transport EHSs, and additional facilities contributing or subjected to additional risk due to their proximity to facilities with EHSs on site, such as hospitals or natural gas facilities;
- Describe procedures to be followed by facility owners and operators and local emergency and medical personnel to respond to any chemical release;
- Designate a community emergency coordinator and facility emergency coordinator(s) to implement the plan;
- Outline emergency notification procedures;
- Describe how to determine the area and population likely affected by the chemical releases;
- Describe local emergency equipment and the facilities and persons responsible for them;
- Outline evacuation plans;
- Provide a training program for emergency responders; and,
- Provide methods and schedules for exercising emergency response plans.

Emergency response plans were initially focused on, but were not limited to, the 406 extremely hazardous substances (EHSs) listed by EPA in 1987. The list has been revised several times since, and, as of October 2020, includes 355 chemicals.



Emergency Release Notification (Section 304)

Section 304 of EPCRA requires facilities to immediately notify the SERC (or TERC) and LEPC (or TEPC) if there is a release into the environment of a hazardous substance that is equal to or exceeds the minimum reportable quantity established in the regulations. This requirement is in addition to the release notification requirements under Section 103 of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA).




Emergency release notification requirements under EPCRA section 304 cover 355 EPCRA EHSs and more than 800 hazardous substances (HSs) (“CERCLA HSs”) listed under CERCLA. (The lists of EPCRA EHSs and CERCLA HSs are codified in 40 CFR parts 355 and 302, respectively). Some chemicals are common to both lists. Initial notification can be made by telephone (most states have hotlines), radio, or in person. Under EPCRA Section 304, notification of releases occurring during transportation can be made by dialing 911, or in the absence of a 911 emergency number, calling the operator.

As stated in EPCRA section 304(b), the initial release notification should include:

- The chemical name;
- An indication of whether it is an extremely hazardous substance;
- An estimate of the quantity released into the environment;
- The time and duration of the release;
- Whether the release occurred into air, water, and/or land;
- Any known or anticipated acute or chronic health risks associated with the emergency, and where necessary, advice regarding medical attention for exposed individuals;
- Proper precautions, such as evacuation or sheltering in place; and
- Name and telephone number of contact person.

Comparison of CERCLA HSs and EPCRA EHSs



As required by EPCRA Section 304(c), a follow-up written report must be submitted to the SERC (or TERC) and LEPC (or TEPC) as soon as practicable² after the release. The follow-up report must update information included in the initial notice and provide information on actual response actions taken and advice regarding medical attention necessary for citizens exposed.

² Many states require the written report to be submitted within 30 days.


Amendments to EPCRA Section 304

In addition to the facility notification requirements described above, Section 2018 of the America's Water Infrastructure Act (AWIA), enacted on October 23, 2018, amended EPCRA Section 304 to require SERCs and TERCs to promptly notify the state drinking water primacy agency (i.e., applicable state agency) of any reportable release and provide this agency with:

- The information collected under section 304(b) from the initial release notification; and
- The follow-up written report received under section 304(c).

The state drinking water primacy agency is then required to promptly provide all the information regarding the release to any community water systems whose source water is affected by the release. A community water system's source water is potentially affected if the release occurs in that system's source water area (also known as a source water protection area) or upstream of the system's water intake. Drinking water primacy agencies and community water systems can provide the boundaries for source water protection areas to the SERCs and TERCs. For states with no state drinking water primacy agency, the SERC and TERC are required to directly notify the potentially affected community water systems.

Hazardous Chemical Inventory Reporting

(Sections 311 and 312)

Under Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations, employers must maintain a material safety data sheet (MSDS) (Safety Data Sheet, SDS) for any hazardous chemicals stored or used in the workplace. Approximately 800,000 products are required to have MSDSs (SDSs).

Section 311 requires facilities that have MSDSs (SDSs) for chemicals held above certain threshold quantities to submit either copies of their MSDSs or a list of these chemicals to the SERC (or TERC), LEPC (or TEPC), and local fire department. If the facility owner or operator chooses to submit a list, it must include the chemical or common name of each substance and must identify the applicable hazard categories. These hazard categories are:



Physical Hazards

- Flammable (gases, aerosols, liquids, or solids)
- Gas under pressure
- Explosive
- Self-heating
- Pyrophoric (liquid or solid)
- Oxidizer (liquid, solid, or gas)
- Organic peroxide
- Self-reactive
- In contact with water emits flammable gas
- Corrosive to metal
- Hazard Not Otherwise Classified (HNOC)

Health Hazards

- Carcinogenicity
- Acute toxicity (any route of exposure)
- Reproductive toxicity
- Skin Corrosion or Irritation
- Respiratory or Skin Sensitization
- Serious eye damage or eye irritation
- Specific target organ toxicity (single or repeated exposure)
- Germ cell mutagenicity
- Aspiration Hazard
- Hazard Not Otherwise Classified (HNOC)

If requested by an LEPC or TEPC, a facility owner or operator must submit a copy of the MSDS (SDS) for any chemical on the list.

Facilities that start using a new hazardous chemical or increase the quantity of a hazardous chemical that exceed the thresholds must submit MSDSs (SDSs) or a list of these chemicals within three months of triggering reporting. Facilities must also provide a revised MSDS (SDS) or list if significant new information is discovered about the hazardous chemical.

Facilities covered by Section 311 must annually submit an Emergency and Hazardous Chemical Inventory Form to the SERC (or TERC), LEPC (or TEPC) and the local fire department as required under Section 312. Facilities provide either a Tier I or Tier II inventory form.

Hazardous Chemical Inventory Reporting (Sections 311 and 312)

The **Tier I inventory form** includes the following aggregate information for each applicable hazard category:

- An estimate (in ranges) of the maximum amount of hazardous chemicals for each category present at the facility at any time during the preceding calendar year;
- An estimate (in ranges) of the average daily amount of hazardous chemicals in each category; and
- The general location of hazardous chemicals in each category.

The **Tier II inventory form** contains basically the same information as the Tier I form, but it must list the specific chemicals. The Tier II inventory form provides the following information for each chemical:

- The chemical name or the common name as indicated on the MSDS;
- An estimate (in ranges) of the maximum amount of the chemical present at any time during the preceding calendar year and the average daily amount;
- A brief description of the manner of storage of the chemical;
- The location of the chemical at the facility; and
- An indication of whether the owner elects to withhold location information from disclosure to the public.

Many states now require facilities to submit Tier II information using Tier2 Submit³ software or the state equivalent including electronic reporting under state law. Tier II information must be submitted on or before March 1 of each year for chemicals present at the facility during the previous year.

Amendments to EPCRA Section 312

Section 2018 of the America's Water Infrastructure Act (AWIA) also amended EPCRA Section 312, requiring SERCs, TERCs, LEPCs, and TEPCs to provide affected community water systems with Tier II information for facilities within their source water area upon request. Source water areas may span multiple jurisdictional boundaries at the state, tribal, and local levels, potentially requiring access to Tier II information from multiple SERCs, TERCs, LEPCs, or TEPCs. If a facility has not complied with Tier II reporting requirements, then the SERC (or TERC) and LEPC (or TEPC) should request that the facility submit its Tier II form and then provide Tier II information to the affected community water systems.

³ Tier2 Submit is an electronic reporting software developed by EPA and NOAA.

Toxics Release Inventory (Sections 313)

The Toxics Release Inventory (TRI) is a publicly available database that contains information on the quantities of certain toxic chemicals released annually to air, water and land, or otherwise managed as waste by facilities throughout the United States.

Facilities in covered industry sectors must report how much of each chemical they manage through recycling, energy recovery, treatment and environmental releases. TRI reporting forms must be submitted to EPA and the appropriate state or tribe by July 1 of each year; these forms contain waste management data for the previous calendar year.

The information submitted by facilities is compiled in the Toxics Release Inventory and made available to the public through online tools, written analyses, and interactive charts and maps at www.epa.gov/tri. This information is always available and free, and supports informed decision-making by communities, government agencies, companies, and others.

TRI includes information about:

- Management (including environmental releases) of lead, mercury, dioxin and other chemicals of concern;
- On-site releases (including disposal) of TRI-covered chemicals to air, surface waters and land;
- On-site recycling, energy recovery, and treatment associated with TRI-covered chemicals;
- Off-site transfers of chemicals from TRI facilities to other locations; and
- Pollution prevention activities at facilities.

TRI reporting is required for facilities that:

- Are in a TRI-covered industry sector;
- Employ the equivalent of 10 or more full-time staff; AND
- Manufacture, process, or otherwise use a TRI-covered chemical in quantities above the established reporting threshold (see page 9).

Some of the ways TRI data can be used include:

- Identifying sources of toxic chemical releases;
- Providing a basis for community discussions, educational activities, and public health research;
- Helping companies learn from each other's best practices to reduce pollution; and
- Combining TRI with health data and other information to better understand potential environmental and human health hazards.

Other EPCRA Provisions*

Trade Secrets

EPCRA Section 322 allows facilities to file trade secret claims in their reports under EPCRA Sections 303, 311, 312, and 313. Only the specific chemical identity may be claimed as a trade secret, though a generic class for the chemical must be provided. The criteria a facility must meet to claim a chemical identity as a trade secret are in 40 CFR part 350. A facility cannot claim trade secrets under EPCRA section 304.

Even if specific chemical identity information can be legally withheld from the public, EPCRA Section 323 allows the information to be disclosed to health professionals who need to use it for diagnostic and treatment purposes, or to local health officials conducting studies, sampling, and other medical research activities. In non-emergency cases, the health professional must sign a confidentiality agreement with the facility and provide a written statement of need. During a medical emergency, the health professional may obtain the specific chemical identity from the facility for treatment.

Any person may challenge trade secret claims by petitioning EPA. The Agency must then review the claim and rule on its validity.

EPCRA Penalties

EPCRA Section 325 allows for civil and administrative penalties ranging from up to \$23,331 - \$174,985⁴ per violation per day when facilities fail to comply with the reporting requirements. Criminal penalties up to \$50,000 or five years in prison apply to any person who knowingly and willfully fails to provide emergency release notification. Penalties of not more than \$20,000 and/or up to one year in prison apply to any person who knowingly and willfully discloses any information entitled to protection as a trade secret.

Citizens Suits

EPCRA Section 326 allows citizens to initiate civil actions against EPA, SERCs, TERCs and the owner or operator of a facility for failure to meet certain EPCRA requirements. A SERC, TERC, LEPC, TEPC, and state or local government may institute actions against facility owner or operator for failure to comply with EPCRA requirements. In addition, states may sue EPA for failure to provide trade secret information.

⁴ The penalty amounts described have been adjusted by the 2020 Civil Monetary Penalty Inflation Adjustment Rule, mandated by the 2015 amendments to the Federal Civil Penalty Inflation Adjustment Act, 28 U.S.C. § 2461 note, Pub. Key EPCRA Definitions

Affected Community Water System(s): One or more community water systems (Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) section 1401(15)) that receives supplies of drinking water from a source water protection area, delineated under SDWA Section 1453, in which a facility that is required to prepare and submit an inventory form is located.

Community Water Systems: A system that provides water for human consumption through pipes or other constructed conveyances and has at least fifteen service connections or regularly serves at least twenty-five individuals, and which serves the same population year-round (SDWA Section 1401(15)).

Extremely Hazardous Substance (EHS): EHSs are listed in the Code of Federal Regulations at 40 CFR part 355, Appendices A and B.

Facility: A facility means all buildings, equipment, structures, and other stationary items that are located on a single site or on contiguous or adjacent sites and that are owned or operated by the same person (or by any person that controls, is controlled by, or under common control with, such person).

Hazardous Substance (HS): Hazardous substances defined under CERCLA and their reportable quantities are listed in the Code of Federal Regulations at 40 CFR part 302, Table 302.4.

State Drinking Water Primacy Agency (i.e., applicable state agency): the drinking water primacy agency that has primary responsibility to enforce the requirements of the SDWA in a state. For links to the various drinking water primacy agencies, see www.asdwa.org/links.

Toxic Chemical: In general, for TRI reporting purposes, a toxic chemical is one that causes 1) cancer or other chronic human health effects; 2) significant adverse acute human health effects; and/or 3) significant adverse environmental effects. Chemicals subject to TRI reporting requirements are defined by EPCRA Section 313 and modified through EPA rulemakings. See the complete TRI chemical list at www.epa.gov/tri/chemicals.

The Local Government Assistance Program was established in 1997 under Transportation Code §201.706 and requires the Department to assist counties with surplus materials to repair and maintain county roads. Giving preference to counties with an above average number of overweight trucks receiving weight tolerance permits based on the previous year's permit totals.

The rules for this program (43 Texas Administrative Code §29.3) provide the procedures used to determine the allocation to each county. Based on current inventories, maximum use of surplus materials on hand is expected to meet the allocations. When surplus materials on hand are not available in sufficient quantities or the haul distance or cost is prohibitive, new materials will be made available.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT
FOR PERFORMANCE OF POSTMORTEM EXAMINATIONS
BY HARRIS COUNTY INSTITUTE OF FORENSIC SCIENCES

THE STATE OF TEXAS §
 §
COUNTY OF HARRIS §

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT (the “Agreement”) is made pursuant to chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code (the Interlocal Cooperation Act) and chapter 49 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, and entered into by and between **Harris County**, acting by and through its governing body, the Harris County Commissioners Court, and **Walker County** (the “Requesting County”), acting by and through its governing body, the Polk County Commissioners Court.

RECITALS:

Pursuant to article 49.25 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Harris County has established and maintains the Harris County Institute of Forensic Sciences which includes the Office of Medical Examiner;

The Requesting County does not have a medical examiner, and a justice of the peace is required to conduct an inquest into the death of a person who dies in the county under certain circumstances;

If the justice of the peace determines that a postmortem examination is necessary, the justice of the peace may order that a postmortem examination of the body be performed by a physician; and

The Requesting County desires to obtain the services of the Harris County Institute of Forensic Sciences (the “Medical Examiner”) to perform postmortem examinations on persons who died in the Requesting County and to provide sworn testimony in connection with any inquest by a justice of the peace or any criminal investigation or prosecution conducted by a prosecuting attorney.

NOW, THEREFORE, Harris County and the Requesting County, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, do mutually agree as follows:

TERMS:

I.
TERM

The term of this Agreement shall begin on **January 1, 2023 and end on December 31, 2023**, unless terminated in accordance with the provisions contained herein.

II.
SERVICES

A. Postmortem Examinations. Postmortem examinations will be performed by the Medical Examiner pursuant to chapter 49 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure. In those cases where a complete autopsy is deemed unnecessary by the Medical Examiner to ascertain the cause and manner of death, the Medical Examiner may perform an external examination of the body, which may include taking x-rays of the body and extracting bodily fluids for laboratory analysis.

1. *Written Request*. When a justice of the peace in the Requesting County determines pursuant to article 49.10 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, that a postmortem examination is necessary on the body of a deceased person who died within their jurisdiction, the justice of the peace may request that the Medical Examiner perform an autopsy. Each request for a postmortem examination shall be in writing, accompanied by an order signed by the justice of the peace. However, the Medical Examiner shall have the discretion to perform an autopsy or external examination of the body based on his professional judgment.

2. *Written Records.* The following records shall accompany the body: (1) the completed form titled “Harris County Medical Examiner Out of County Investigator’s Report” (attached hereto and incorporated herein); (2) the entire police report, including scene photographs and; (3) all relevant medical records, including hospital admission and emergency room records, if applicable. Failure to provide all necessary records may result in the Medical Examiner refusing to accept the body for a postmortem examination.
3. *Body Bag.* Each body transported to the Medical Examiner for a postmortem examination must be enclosed inside a zippered body bag and sealed in such a way as to insure integrity of evidence between the time of scene investigation and arrival at the Medical Examiner. The body bag shall have the deceased’s name affixed to the outside.

B. Laboratory Analyses. The Medical Examiner shall conduct a postmortem toxicological analysis, if appropriate, and any other tests considered necessary to assist in determining the cause and manner of death and identification.

C. Testimony. Medical Examiner personnel performing services pursuant to this agreement shall appear as reasonably necessary to provide testimony in a criminal case before a district court of the Requesting County. The Requesting County agrees to use its best efforts to schedule the testimony of the Medical Examiner’s personnel in such a manner to cause the least amount of disruption in their work schedule.

D. Reports. Within a reasonable time after the completion of a postmortem examination, the Medical Examiner will provide a written copy of the autopsy report to the justice of the peace who requested the autopsy.

E. Transportation. The Requesting County shall have the sole responsibility for transporting the deceased to the Medical Examiner. Upon notification by the Medical Examiner that the autopsy has been completed, the Requesting County shall make arrangements for the deceased to be transported immediately to a funeral home.

F. Training. The Medical Examiner will conduct an annual training seminar in Houston for justices of the peace, their court personnel and other criminal justice officials, including investigators.

G. No Interment. Harris County shall have no responsibility for burying the remains of the deceased. Consistent with TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ANN. § 711.002(e), the Requesting County shall have sole responsibility for interment of the body.

III.

CONSIDERATION FOR SERVICES

A. Autopsy Fees. In consideration for the services provided by the Medical Examiner, the Requesting County agrees to pay Harris County all costs and expenses associated with performing the autopsy in accordance with the following schedule:

B. Ancillary Tests. Ancillary tests (i.e. GSR tests) will be performed as deemed appropriate by the Medical Examiner at no additional cost. If further tests are requested by the Requesting County, but are deemed by the Medical Examiner not germane based on the circumstances of the case, the Medical Examiner may elect to decline the request, or to request that the laboratory of the HCIFS perform those tests with additional charges in accordance with the Fee Schedule, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit “A.”

C. Testimony. The Requesting County shall additionally pay Harris County for the time spent by the Medical Examiner’s pathologists, the Chief Toxicologist, or other personnel providing sworn testimony in connection with a postmortem examination requested by the Requesting County. Testimony fee are in accordance with the Harris County Medical Examiner’s Fee Schedule,

attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A." These rates shall apply also to pretrial preparation, attendance at pretrial conferences, travel time and any time spent waiting to provide testimony.

D. Storage of Bodies. The Requesting County shall pay Harris County the additional sum of Forty Five Dollars (\$45) per day for each body that remains at the Medical Examiner beyond three (3) days (including weekends and holidays) beginning the day after notification by the Medical Examiner that the body is ready to be released to the Requesting County. This provision shall survive termination of this Agreement and shall apply to any bodies currently remaining at the Medical Examiner.

E. Invoice. Harris County shall submit an invoice to the Requesting County for post mortem services performed under this Agreement within thirty (30) days after the service is completed. The Requesting County shall pay the total amount of the invoice within thirty (30) days of the date of receipt of the invoice by the Requesting County. If the Requesting County fails to pay any invoice within sixty (60) days after receipt, the Medical Examiner may refuse to accept any additional bodies for autopsy.

F. Fair Compensation. Harris County and the Requesting County agree and acknowledge that the contractual payments contemplated by this agreement are reasonable and fairly compensate Harris County for the services or functions performed under this Agreement.

G. Death Certificates. The justice of the peace who requested the postmortem examination be performed shall provide the Medical Examiner with a copy of the signed Certificate of Death no later than fourteen (14) days after receipt of the autopsy report. Failure to comply with this provision may result in termination of the contract by Harris County.

IV. FUNDS

A. Current Funds. The Requesting County agrees and acknowledges that the contractual payments in this Agreement shall be made to Harris County from current revenues available to the Requesting County.

B. Certified Availability. The Requesting County has available and has specifically allocated \$30,000.00, as evidenced by a certification of funds by the Requesting County's County Auditor. In the event funds certified available by the Requesting County's County Auditor are no longer sufficient to compensate Harris County for the services provided under this Agreement, Harris County shall have no further obligation to complete the performance of any services until the Requesting County certifies sufficient additional current funds. The Requesting County agrees to immediately notify Harris County regarding any additional certification of funds for this Agreement.

C. Other Statutory Liability. This Agreement is not intended to limit any statutory liability of the Requesting County to pay for services provided by Harris County when the funds certified by the Requesting County are no longer sufficient to compensate Harris County for the services provided under this Agreement.

D. Overdue Payments. It is understood and agreed that chapter 2251 of the Texas Government Code applies to late payments.

V. TERMINATION

A. Without Notice. If the Requesting County defaults in the payment of any obligation in this Agreement, Harris County is authorized to terminate this Agreement immediately without notice.

B. With Notice. It is understood and agreed that either party may terminate this Agreement prior to the expiration of the term set forth above, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. By the next business day following the first ten (10) days of the subsequent calendar month after the effective date of such termination, Harris County will submit an invoice showing the amounts due for the month in which termination occurs in the manner set out above for submitting monthly invoices.

VI.
NOTICE

Any notice required to be given under the provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be duly served when it shall have been deposited, enclosed in a wrapper with the proper postage prepaid thereon, and duly registered or certified, return receipt requested, in a United States Post Office, addressed to the parties at the following addresses:

VII.
MERGER

The parties agree that this Agreement contains all of the terms and conditions of the understanding of the parties relating to the subject matter hereof. All prior negotiations, discussions, correspondence and preliminary understandings between the parties and others relating hereto are superseded by this Agreement.

VIII.
VENUE

Exclusive venue for any action arising out of or related to this Agreement shall be in Harris County, Texas.

IX.
MISCELLANEOUS

This instrument contains the entire Agreement between the parties relating to the rights granted and the obligations assumed. Any oral or written representations or modifications concerning this instrument shall be of no force and effect excepting a subsequent modification in writing signed by both parties. This Agreement may be executed in duplicate counterparts, each having equal force and effect of an original. This Agreement shall become binding and effective only after it has been authorized and approved by both counties, as evidenced by the signature of the appropriate authority pursuant to an order of the Commissioners Court of the respective County authorizing such execution.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

This Agreement is made and entered into, by and between the Houston-Galveston Area Council hereinafter referred to as H-GAC having its principal place of business at 3555 Timmons Lane, Suite 120, Houston, Texas 77027 and Walker County, hereinafter referred to as the Subrecipient, having its principal place of business at 1100 University Avenue, Huntsville, TX 77340.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, H-GAC hereby engages the Subrecipient to perform certain services in accordance with the specifications of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Subrecipient has agreed to perform such services in accordance with the specifications of the Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, H-GAC and the Subrecipient do hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1: LEGAL AUTHORITY

The Subrecipient warrants and assures H-GAC that it possesses adequate legal authority to enter into this Agreement. The Subrecipient's governing body, where applicable, has authorized the signatory official(s) to enter into this Agreement and bind the Subrecipient to the terms of this Agreement and any subsequent amendments hereto.

ARTICLE 2: APPLICABLE LAWS

The Subrecipient agrees to conduct all activities under this Agreement in accordance with all applicable rules, regulations, directives, standards, ordinances, and laws, in effect or promulgated during the term of this Agreement, including without limitation, workers' compensation laws, minimum and maximum salary and wage statutes and regulations, and licensing laws and regulations. When required, the Subrecipient shall furnish H-GAC with satisfactory proof of its compliance therewith.

ARTICLE 3: INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The execution of this Agreement and the rendering of services prescribed by this Agreement do not change the independent status of H-GAC or the Subrecipient. No provision of this Agreement or act of H-GAC in performance of the Agreement shall be construed as making the Subrecipient the agent, servant, or employee of H-GAC, the State of Texas, or the United States Government. Employees of the Subrecipient are subject to the exclusive control and supervision of the Subrecipient. The Subrecipient is solely responsible for employee related disputes and discrepancies, including employee payrolls and any claims arising therefrom.

ARTICLE 4: WHOLE AGREEMENT

The General Provisions, Special Provisions, and Attachments, as provided herein, constitute the complete Agreement ("Agreement") between the parties hereto, and supersede any and all oral and written agreements between the parties relating to matters herein. Except as otherwise provided herein, this Agreement cannot be modified without written consent of the parties.

ARTICLE 5: SCOPE OF WORK

The services to be performed by the Subrecipient are outlined in an Attachment to this Agreement.

ARTICLE 6: PERFORMANCE PERIOD

This Agreement shall be performed during the period which begins Nov 01 2022 and ends Jun 30 2023. All services under this Agreement must be rendered within this performance period, unless directly specified under a written change or extension provisioned under Article 15, which shall be fully executed by both parties to this Agreement.

ARTICLE 7: PAYMENT OR FUNDING

Any payment or funding claimed by Subrecipient shall be paid by H-GAC only under the specific terms set forth in the Special Provisions and Scope of Work. Subrecipient agrees that payments are predicated upon properly documented and verified proof of performance delivered, and costs incurred by the Subrecipient, in accordance with the terms outlined by the Special Provisions of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 8: REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

If the Subrecipient fails to submit to H-GAC in a timely and satisfactory manner any report required by this Agreement, or otherwise fails to satisfactorily render performances hereunder, H-GAC may withhold payments otherwise due and owing the Subrecipient hereunder. Subrecipient's failure in reporting or performance may be considered cause for termination of this Agreement. If H-GAC withholds such payments, it shall notify the Subrecipient of its decision. Payments withheld pursuant to this Article may be held by H-GAC until such time as the delinquent obligations for which funds are withheld are fulfilled by the Subrecipient. The Subrecipient's failure to timely submit any report may also be considered cause for termination of this Agreement.

Any additional reporting requirements shall be set forth in the Special Provisions of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 9: NON-FUNDING CLAUSE

Any obligation of H-GAC created by this Agreement is conditioned upon the availability of state or federal funds appropriated or allocated for the payment of such obligations. H-GAC shall not be otherwise obligated or liable for any future payments due, or for any damages as a result of interruption of payment or termination.

ARTICLE 10: INSURANCE

Subrecipient shall maintain insurance coverage for work performed or services rendered under this Agreement as outlined and defined in the attached Special Provisions.

ARTICLE 11: SUBCONTRACTS

Except as may be set forth in the Special Provisions, the Subrecipient agrees not to subcontract, assign, transfer, convey, sublet, or otherwise dispose of this Agreement or any right, title, obligation, or interest it may have therein to any third party without prior written approval of H-GAC. The Subrecipient acknowledges that H-GAC is not liable to any subcontractor or assignee of the Subrecipient. The Subrecipient shall ensure that the performance rendered under all subcontracts shall result in compliance with all the terms and provisions of this Agreement as if the performance rendered was rendered by the Subrecipient. Subrecipient shall give all required notices, and comply with all laws and regulations applicable to furnishing and performance of the work. Except where otherwise expressly required by applicable law or regulation, H-GAC shall not be responsible for monitoring Subrecipient's compliance, or that of Subrecipient's subcontractors, with any laws or regulations.

ARTICLE 12: AUDIT

Notwithstanding any other audit requirement, H-GAC reserves the right to conduct or cause to be conducted an independent audit of any transaction under this Agreement, such audit may be performed by the H-GAC local government audit staff, a certified public accountant firm, or other auditors designated by H-GAC and will be conducted in accordance with applicable professional standards and practices. Subrecipient who spend seven-hundred fifty thousand dollars (750,000) or more of federal assistance under this contract or cumulatively under all federal contracts in a fiscal year are required to have an audit conducted annually in compliance with 2 CFR 200. Subrecipient agrees to submit all written reports of monitoring or audits to H-GAC within 30 days of issuance. Any reports that contain findings from an auditor must also include a corrective action plan from the Subrecipient in accordance with 2 CFR 200.511.

The Subrecipient understands and agrees that the Subrecipient shall be liable to the H-GAC for anything disallowed as a result of audit, in which case future payments are predicated upon repayment as set forth in the Special Provisions.

ARTICLE 13: EXAMINATION OF RECORDS

The Subrecipient shall maintain during the course of the work complete and accurate records of all of the Subrecipient's costs and documentation of items which are chargeable to H-GAC under this Agreement. H-GAC, through its staff or

designated public accounting firm, the State of Texas, and United States Government, shall have the right at any reasonable time to inspect, copy and audit those records on or off the premises by authorized representatives of its own or any public accounting firm selected by H-GAC. The right of access to records is not limited to the required retention period, but shall last as long as the records are retained. Failure to provide access to records may be cause for termination of the Agreement. The records to be thus maintained and retained by the Subrecipient shall include (without limitation): (1) personnel and payroll records, including social security numbers and labor classifications, accounting for total time distribution of the Subrecipient's employees working full or part time on the work, as well as cancelled payroll checks, signed receipts for payroll payments in cash, or other evidence of disbursement of payroll payments; (2) invoices for purchases, receiving and issuing documents, and all other unit inventory records for the Subrecipient's stocks or capital items; and (3) paid invoices and cancelled checks for materials purchased and for subcontractors' and any other third parties' charges.

The Subrecipient further agrees to include in all its subcontracts, permitted pursuant to Article 11 hereof. The Subrecipient agrees that H-GAC and its duly authorized representatives shall until the expiration of seven (7) years after final payment under the subcontract or until all audit findings have been resolved, have access to and the right to examine and copy any directly pertinent books, documents, papers, invoices, and records of such subcontractor involving transactions relating to the subcontract.

ARTICLE 14: RETENTION OF RECORDS

The Subrecipient shall maintain all records pertinent to this Agreement, and all other financial, statistical, property, participant records, and supporting documentation for a period of no less than seven (7) years from the later of the date of acceptance of the final contract closeout. If any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit, or other action involving the records has been started before the expiration of the retention period, the records shall be retained until completion of the action and resolution of all issues which arise from it, or until the end of the seven (7) years, whichever is later, and until any outstanding litigation, audit, or claim has been fully resolved.

ARTICLE 15: CHANGES AND AMENDMENTS

- A. Any alterations, additions, or deletions to the terms of this Agreement, which are required by changes in federal or state Law or by regulations, are automatically incorporated without written amendment hereto, and shall become effective on the date designated by such law or by regulation.
- B. To ensure the legal and effective performance of this Agreement, both parties agree that H-GAC may amend performance under this Agreement, during the contract period, by issuing policy directives to establish or clarify performance requirements under this Agreement. After a period of no less than 30 days subsequent to written notice, unless sooner implementation is required by law, such policy directives shall have the effect of qualifying the terms of this Agreement and shall be binding upon the Subrecipient as if written herein, provided however that such policy directives shall not alter the terms of this Agreement so as to relieve H-GAC of any obligation specified in this Agreement to reimburse Subrecipient for costs properly incurred prior to the effective date of such policy directives.
- C. Except as specifically provided by subsections A and B of this Article, any other alterations, additions, or deletions to the terms of this Agreement shall be by modification hereto in writing, and executed by both parties to this Agreement.

ARTICLE 16: TERMINATION PROCEDURES

The Subrecipient acknowledges that this Agreement may be terminated for Convenience or Default.

A. Convenience

H-GAC may terminate this Agreement at any time, in whole or in part, with or without cause, whenever H-GAC determines that for any reason such termination is in the best interest of H-GAC, by providing written notice by certified mail to the Subrecipient. Upon receipt of notice of termination, all services hereunder of the Subrecipient and its employees and subcontractors shall cease to the extent specified in the notice of termination.

The Subrecipient may cancel or terminate this Agreement upon submission of thirty (30) days written notice, presented to H-GAC via certified mail. The Subrecipient may not give notice of cancellation after it has received notice of default from H-GAC.

B. Default

H-GAC may, by written notice of default to the Subrecipient, terminate the whole or any part of the Agreement, in any one of the following circumstances:

- (1) If the Subrecipient fails to perform the services herein specified within the time specified herein or any extension thereof; or
- (2) If the Subrecipient fails to perform any of the other provisions of this Agreement for any reason whatsoever, or so fails to make progress or otherwise violates the Agreements that completion of services herein specified within the Agreement term is significantly endangered, and in either of these two instances does not cure such failure within a period often (10) days (or such longer period of time as may be authorized by H-GAC in writing) after receiving written notice by certified mail of default from H-GAC.

ARTICLE 17: SEVERABILITY

H-GAC and Subrecipient agree that should any provision of this Agreement be determined to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect any other term of this Agreement, which shall continue in full force and effect.

ARTICLE 18: FORCE MAJEURE

To the extent that either party to this Agreement shall be wholly or partially prevented from the performance of any obligation or duty placed on such party by reason of or through strikes, stoppage of labor, riot, fire, flood, acts of war, insurrection, accident, order of any court, act of God, or specific cause reasonably beyond the party's control and not attributable to its neglect or nonfeasance, in such event, the time for the performance of such obligation or duty shall be suspended until such disability to perform is removed. Determination of force majeure shall rest solely with H-GAC.

ARTICLE 19: COPYRIGHTS

H-GAC, and any related state or federal awarding agency, reserve a royalty-free, nonexclusive, and irrevocable license to reproduce, publish or otherwise use, and to authorize others to use, for state or federal government or H-GAC purposes:

- A. The copyright of all maps, data, reports, research, or other work developed under this Agreement;
- B. Any copyrights or rights of use to copyrighted material which the Subrecipient purchases with funding under this Agreement. All such data and material shall be furnished to H-GAC upon request.

ARTICLE 20: OWNERSHIP OF MATERIALS

Except as may be specified in the Special Provisions, all data, reports, research, etc., developed by the Subrecipient solely as a part of its work under this Agreement, shall become the property of the H-GAC upon completion of this Agreement, or in the event of termination or cancellation hereof. All such data and material shall be furnished to H-GAC at no charge and upon request. Subrecipient further agrees not to release information about results or deliverables connected to this Agreement to anyone outside of H-GAC, without first obtaining written release authorization from H-GAC.

ARTICLE 21: POLITICAL ACTIVITY - LOBBYING

Nothing related, connected to, or provided under this Agreement may be used in any way to attempt to influence in any manner a member of Congress to favor or oppose any legislation or appropriation by Congress, or for lobbying with state or local legislators. The Subrecipient, if a recipient of Federal assistance exceeding 100,000 dollars through an H-GAC subcontract, will comply with section 319, Public Law 101-121 (31 U.S.C. 1352).

ARTICLE 22: SECTARIAN INVOLVEMENT PROHIBITED

The Subrecipient shall ensure that no funds under this Agreement are used, either directly or indirectly, in the support of any religious or anti-religious activity, worship, or instruction.

ARTICLE 23: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

No officer, member or employee of the Subrecipient or Subrecipient's subcontractor, no member of the governing body of the Subrecipient, and no other public officials of the Subrecipient who exercise any functions or responsibilities in the review or Subrecipient approval of this Agreement, shall participate in any decision relating to this Agreement which affects his or her personal interest, or shall have any personal or pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement.

ARTICLE 24: FEDERAL COMPLIANCE

Subrecipient agrees to comply with all federal statutes relating to nondiscrimination, labor standards, and environmental compliance. Additionally, for work to be performed under the Agreement or subcontract thereof, including procurement of materials or leases of equipment, Subrecipient shall notify each potential subcontractor or supplier of the Subrecipient's federal compliance obligations. These may include, but are not limited to: (a) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352) which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin; (b) Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. §§ 1681-1683, and 1685-1686), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex; (c) the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 USC 676 et. seq.), (d) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. § 794), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicaps and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; (e) the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967 (29 USC 621 et. seq.) and the Age Discrimination Act of 1974, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§ 6101-6107), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of age; (f) the Drug Abuse Office and Treatment Act of 1972 (P.L. 92-255), as amended, relating to nondiscrimination on the basis of drug abuse; (g) the Comprehensive Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism Prevention, Treatment and Rehabilitation Act of 1970 (P.L. 91-616), as amended, relating to the nondiscrimination on the basis of alcohol abuse or alcoholism; (h) §§ 523 and 527 of the Public Health Service Act of 1912 (42 U.S.C. 290 dd-3 and 290 ee-3), as amended, relating to confidentiality of alcohol and drug abuse patient records; (i) Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. § 3601 et seq.), as amended, relating to nondiscrimination in the sale, rental or financing of housing; (j) any other nondiscrimination provisions in any specific statute(s) applicable to any Federal funding for this Agreement; (k) the requirements of any other nondiscrimination statute(s) which may apply to this Agreement; (l) applicable provisions of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. §7401 et seq.), the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. §1251 et seq.), Section 508 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1251), Executive Order 11738, and the Environmental Protection Agency regulations at 40 CFR Part 15; (m) applicable provisions of the Davis- Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 276a - 276a-7), the Copeland Act (40 U.S.C. 276c), and the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708), as set forth in Department of Labor Regulations at 20 CFR 5.5a; (n) the mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the state energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (P.L. 94-163).

ARTICLE 25: PROHIBITION ON CONTRACTING WITH ENTITIES USING CERTAIN TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND VIDEO SURVEILLANCE EQUIPMENT (EFFECTIVE AUG. 13, 2020 AND AS AMENDED OCTOBER 26, 2020)

Pursuant to 2 CFR 200.216, Contractor shall not offer equipment, services, or system that use covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system. Covered telecommunications equipment or services means 1) telecommunications equipment produced by Huawei Technologies Company or ZTE Corporation (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities); 2) for the purpose of public safety, security of government facilities, physical security surveillance of critical infrastructure, and other national security purposes, video surveillance and telecommunications equipment produced by Hytera Communications Corporation, Hangzhou Hikvision Digital Technology Company, or Dahua Technology Company (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities); 3) telecommunications or video surveillance services provided by such entities or using such equipment; or 4) telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by an entity that the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of National Intelligence or the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reasonably believes to be an entity owned or controlled by, or otherwise connected to, the government of a covered foreign country. Respondent must comply with requirements for certifications. The provision at 48 C.F.R Section 52.204-26 requires that offerors review SAM prior to completing their required representations. This rule applies to all acquisitions, including acquisitions at or below the simplified acquisition threshold and to acquisitions of commercial items, including commercially available off-the-shelf items.

ARTICLE 26: DOMESTIC PREFERENCE

In accordance with 2 CFR 200.322, as appropriate and to the extent consistent with law, when using federal grant award funds H-GAC should, to the greatest extent practicable, provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United States (including but not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products). H-GAC must include this requirement in all subawards including all contracts and purchase orders for work or products under the federal grant award. If Contractor intends to qualify for

Purchase Orders using federal grant money, then it shall work with H-GAC to provide all required certifications and other documentation needed to show compliance.

ARTICLE 27: CRIMINAL PROVISIONS AND SANCTIONS

The Subrecipient agrees to perform the Agreement in conformance with safeguards against fraud and abuse as set forth by the H-GAC, the State of Texas, and the acts and regulations of any related state or federal agency. The Subrecipient agrees to promptly notify H-GAC of any actual or suspected fraud, abuse, or other criminal activity through the filing of a written report within twenty-four (24) hours of knowledge thereof. Subrecipient shall notify H-GAC of any accident or incident requiring medical attention arising from its activities under this Agreement within twenty-four (24) hours of such occurrence. Theft or willful damage to property on loan to the Subrecipient from H-GAC, if any, shall be reported to local law enforcement agencies and H-GAC within two (2) hours of discovery of any such act.

The Subrecipient further agrees to cooperate fully with H-GAC, local law enforcement agencies, the State of Texas, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and any other duly authorized investigative unit, in carrying out a full investigation of all such incidents.

The Subrecipient shall notify H-GAC of the threat of lawsuit or of any actual suit filed against the Subrecipient pertaining to this Agreement or which would adversely affect the Subrecipient's ability to perform services under this Agreement.

ARTICLE 28: INDEMNIFICATION AND RECOVERY

To the extent permitted by law, H-GAC shall indemnify and hold Subrecipient harmless against any and all claims, demands, damages, liabilities, and costs incurred by Subrecipient which directly or indirectly result from, or arise in connection with, any negligent act or omission of H-GAC, its agents, or employees, pertaining to its activities and obligations under this Agreement.

Subrecipient shall indemnify and hold H-GAC, its officers, agents, and employees harmless against any and all claims, demands, damages, liabilities, and costs (including reasonable attorney fees) which directly or indirectly result from, or arise in connection with, any negligent act or omission of Subrecipient, its agents, or employees pertaining to its activities and obligations under this Agreement.

In no event will H-GAC be liable for any loss of use, loss of time, inconvenience, commercial loss, lost profits, or savings; or other incidental special or consequential damages to the full extent such use may be disclaimed by law during the period of this contract and its related procurements. If Subrecipient performs an act knowing or having reason to know that it is contrary to any law or regulation, the Subrecipient shall bear all claims, costs, losses, and damages caused by, arising out of, or resulting from that act.

ARTICLE 29: TITLES NOT RESTRICTIVE

The titles assigned to the various Articles of this Agreement are for convenience only. Titles shall not be considered restrictive of the subject matter of any Article, or part of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 30: JOINT WORK PRODUCT

This Agreement is the joint work product of H-GAC and the Subrecipient. This Agreement has been negotiated by H-GAC and the Subrecipient and their respective counsel and shall be fairly interpreted in accordance with its terms and, in the event of any ambiguities, no inferences shall be drawn against any party.

ARTICLE 31: DISPUTES

All disputes concerning questions of fact or of law arising under this Agreement, which are not addressed within the Whole Agreement as defined pursuant to Article 4 hereof, shall be decided by the Executive Director of H-GAC or his designee, who shall reduce his decision to writing and provide notice thereof to the Subrecipient. The decision of the Executive Director or his designee shall be final and conclusive unless, within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of such notice, the Subrecipient requests a rehearing from the Executive Director of H-GAC. In connection with any rehearing under this Article, the Subrecipient shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and offer evidence in support of its position. The decision of the Executive Director after any such rehearing shall be final and conclusive. The Subrecipient may, if it elects to do so, appeal the final and conclusive decision of the Executive Director to a court of

competent jurisdiction. Pending final decision of a dispute hereunder, the Subrecipient shall proceed diligently with the performance of the Agreement and in accordance with H- GAC's final decision.

ARTICLE 32: CHOICE OF LAW - VENUE

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Venue and jurisdiction of any suit or cause of action arising under or in connection with the Agreement shall lie exclusively in Harris County, Texas.

ARTICLE 33: ORDER OF PRIORITY

In the case of any conflict between or within this Agreement, the following order of priority shall be utilized: 1) General Provisions, 2) Special Provisions, 3) Scope of Work, and 4) Other Attachments.

ARTICLE 34: UNIVERSAL IDENTIFIER AND SYSTEM FOR AWARD MANAGEMENT (SAM)

In accordance with 2 CFR Title 2, Subtitle A, Chapter I, Part 25 as it applies to a Federal awarding agency's grants, cooperative agreements, loans, and other types of Federal financial assistance as defined in 2 CFR 25.406. Contractor understands and as it relates to 2 CFR 25.205(a), a Federal awarding agency may not make a Federal award or financial modification to an existing Federal award to an applicant or recipient until the entity has complied with the requirements described in 2 CFR 25.200 to provide a valid unique entity identifier and maintain an active SAM registration (www.SAM.gov) with current information (other than any requirement that is not applicable because the entity is exempted under § 25.110). 2 CFR 25.200(b) requires that registration in the SAM **prior to submitting an application or plan**; and maintain an active SAM registration with current information, including information on a recipient's immediate and highest level owner and subsidiaries, as well as on all predecessors that have been awarded a Federal contract or grant within the last three years, if applicable, at all times during which it has an active Federal award or an application or plan under consideration by a Federal awarding agency; and provide its unique entity identifier in each application or plan it submits to the Federal awarding agency. To remain registered in the SAM database after the initial registration, the applicant is required to review and update its information in the SAM database on an annual basis from the date of initial registration or subsequent updates to ensure it is current, accurate and complete. At the time a Federal awarding agency is ready to make a Federal award, if the intended recipient has not complied with an applicable requirement to provide a unique entity identifier or maintain an active SAM registration with current information, the Federal awarding agency: (1) May determine that the applicant is not qualified to receive a Federal award; and (2) May use that determination as a basis for making a Federal award to another applicant.

In accordance with 2 CFR 200.323, the Houston-Galveston Area Council and the Contractor or Subrecipient must comply with section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. The requirements of Section 6002 include: (1) procuring only items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the purchase price of the item exceeds \$10,000 or the value of the quantity acquired during the preceding fiscal year exceeded \$10,000; (2) procuring solid waste management services in a manner that maximizes energy and resource recovery; and (3) establishing an affirmative procurement program for procurement of recovered materials identified in the EPA guidelines. Pursuant to the Federal Rule above, as required by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (42 U.S.C. § 6962(c)(3)(A)(i)), the Contractor or Subrecipient certifies that the percentage of recovered materials content for EPA-designated items to be delivered or used in the performance of the Agreement will be at least the amount required by the applicable contract specifications or other contractual requirements.

ARTICLE 36: PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT

H-GAC and the Subrecipient understand and agree that H-GAC is a governmental body for purposes of the Public Information Act, codified as Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code and as such is required to release information in accordance with the Public Information Act (the "Act"). H-GAC must rely on advice, decisions, and opinions of the Attorney General of the State of Texas relative to the disclosure of data or information. Submissions will be kept confidential in accordance with the Act and applicable law, and submissions are subject to inclusion into the public record after award. To the extent permitted by law, the Subrecipient may request in writing non-disclosure of any information that it considers to be confidential, proprietary, and/or trade secret in its submission. Such data shall accompany the submission, be readily separable from the response, and shall be CLEARLY MARKED

“CONFIDENTIAL, PROPRIETARY and/or TRADE SECRET”. H-GAC will make reasonable efforts to provide the Subrecipient notice in accordance with the Act in the event H-GAC receives a request for information under the Act for information that the Subrecipient has marked as indicated above.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

Incorporated by attachment, as part of the whole agreement, H-GAC and the Subrecipient do hereby agree to the following Special Provisions, as follows:

ARTICLE 1: GOVERNING LAW, STANDARDS, AND REGULATIONS

This Agreement is entered into by and between the Subrecipient and H-GAC. The activities funded under this Agreement shall be in accordance with all provisions of this Agreement, all applicable state and local laws, rules, regulations, and guidelines. The main governing standards included, but may not be limited to the following: 1) §361.014 of the Texas Health & Safety Code Ann.; 2) Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC) Chapter 330, Section 330.649, TCEQ Rules and 30 TAC Chapter 14, TCEQ Rules; 3) The Uniform Grant and Contract Management Act, Texas Government Code Ann., §§783.001 et. Seq., and 4) The Interlocal Contract between the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and H-GAC. Neither the TCEQ nor the State of Texas is a party to this Contract. By accepting this agreement, the Subrecipient certifies that it is not delinquent in payment of solid waste disposal fees owed to the State of Texas, if applicable.

ARTICLE 2: MANDATORY ATTACHMENTS

In consideration of the compensation hereinafter described, Subrecipient shall provide H-GAC approved services as specifically described in Attachment A- Scope of Work, attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes. Subrecipient further agrees to implement the requirements of the Scope of Work according to the agreed upon Attachment B-Budget, attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes. Additional attachments incorporated herein for all purposes to this Agreement include, in priority order, Attachment C-Supplemental Funding Standards, Attachment D-Authorized Representatives, Attachment E-Contractor's Original Grant Application.

ARTICLE 3: PARTY LIABILITY

In consideration of full and satisfactory performance hereunder, H-GAC will be liable to Subrecipient in an amount equal to the actual costs incurred by Subrecipient in rendering such performance, subject, but not limited, to the following limitations: 1) H-GAC is not liable for expenditures made in violation of regulations, rules or policies promulgated under applicable local, state, or federal laws, 2) Except as specifically authorized by H-GAC in writing, H-GAC is liable only for expenditures made in compliance with the applicable cost principles and administrative requirements set forth in a properly executed attachment to this Agreement, 3) H-GAC is not liable to Subrecipient for costs incurred or performance rendered before the beginning date or after termination of this Agreement, 4) H-GAC is not liable for any costs incurred in the performance of this Agreement, which have not been billed to H-GAC by the final billing deadline identified in the Scope of Work.

ARTICLE 4: PAYMENTS

A. Maximum Value

Subject to the terms and exclusions outlined in this Agreement, and subject to the confirmation of eligibility under applicable state, local, and federal statutes; H-GAC will reimburse Subrecipient for goods, services, or expenditures on the basis of allowable costs up to the maximum value of this Agreement, or \$5,300.00. Allowable costs must be: certified by H-GAC as correct and necessary, directly associated with performance of this Agreement, provisioned under the Scope of Work or other mutually executed Attachment, and properly submitted at the rates prescribed by state or federal regulations.

B. Increase Request

Any amount requested in excess of this maximum value, must be requested by Subrecipient in writing, and approved by H-GAC, prior to Subrecipient's reimbursement request. Approval or denial of an increase request is at the sole discretion of H-GAC.

C. Timely Submission Required

All requests must be timely submitted to H-GAC. During the Agreement performance period, an invoice or report submission is considered timely when it is received by close of business on the tenth calendar day of a month for the previous month's expenditures. No payment advances will be made by H-GAC. Untimely submissions by Subrecipient could result in a delay or rejection of reimbursement by H-GAC. An invoice or report from Subrecipient must be delivered to H-GAC each month, whether or not any expenses have occurred.

D. Progress Reports

To obtain reimbursement, quarterly Progress Report submissions is required of Subrecipient, as outlined under the separate Scope of Work.

E. Timely Processing

Reimbursement from H-GAC shall be processed monthly, within forty-five (45) days after the receipt of the Subrecipient's completed invoice with substantive supporting documentation.

F. Format of Request; Required Information

Subrecipient shall use the approved H-GAC Reimbursement Form or Report Form template, to provide substantive supporting documentation and request reimbursement, if a template is attached to this Agreement. If no templated form is attached, Subrecipient shall submit: 1) A detailed account of actual costs of the services provided, including number of hours and cost per hour, and 2) Information regarding any subcontracted service provider, including: name of agency, address of agency, name of owner/operator, and owner/operator credentials. Additionally, detailed information pertaining to: Personnel, Equipment, Travel, Contract Services, and Marketing, must be provided and certified by Subrecipient to obtain reimbursement from H-GAC.

G. Additional Approvals Required:

Subrecipient shall notify and receive prior written approval from H-GAC, providing specific details of an expense or purchase, for any expenses not already authorized under this agreement. This may include:

- a) Changes in personnel whose salaries will be funded under the sub-grant.
- b) Out-of-state travel and special out-of-region travel to training events and conferences. Prior to authorizing any out-of-state travel by a Subrecipient, H-GAC shall obtain written approval from the TCEQ to provide such authorization.
- c) Equipment, construction, or contractual expenses.
- d) "Other" category expenses, not specifically authorized in the Subrecipient agreement.

ARTICLE 5: FINAL REPORTS

No later than thirty (30) days following the termination of this Agreement, the Subrecipient must submit to H-GAC a Report Form marked "Final". This final report shall notify H-GAC that no further reimbursement requests will be made against this Agreement.

H-GAC will notify Subrecipient of any corrections to amendment of or missing deliverables within 30 days of H-GAC's receipt. H-GAC will remit final payment after satisfactory completion of all contract conditions.

Upon completion of the Scope of Work, the Subrecipient will submit all materials specified as deliverables in the Scope of Work. Subrecipient shall furnish H-GAC with all computer files pertaining to the Scope of Work, that were not previously transmitted.

ARTICLE 6: PROGRESS REPORTS

Subrecipient shall submit quarterly progress reports documenting task-specific accomplishments, units of work performed, and program results achieved, as outlined in the Scope of Work of this Agreement.

A. Compliance

Subrecipient shall report its own internal legal efforts to ensure compliance with funding or administrative standards. Subrecipient is solely responsible for compliance, and any supplemental guidance produced or provided by H-GAC in no way absolves or diminishes Subrecipient liability. Any information provided by H-GAC should not be relied upon as a wholly exhaustive list of recommendations, provisions, or regulatory requirements.

B. Format of Report

Subrecipient shall use the approved H-GAC Progress Report form template, if a template is attached to this Agreement. If no templated form is attached, Subrecipient shall submit a Progress Report that must include: 1) A brief description of work accomplished for each task, 2) The percentage of completion of the overall work project and each task, 3) Changes in the estimated value (budget) of each work task, 4) Special problems or delays encountered or anticipated, and 5) The anticipated work activities for the next work period.

C. Other Reports

Subrecipient shall submit other information as may be required by H-GAC, such as: contract closeout reports, special requested data, follow-up reports, or ad hoc reports and information on the operation and performance of this Agreement. H-GAC shall provide a reasonable time for response, in consideration of the nature and availability of the information requested.

D. Breach

Subrecipient's failure to comply with the requirements of this Article shall constitute a breach of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 7: STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE

1. H-GAC shall employ the following standards to monitor performance. Subrecipient agrees to the following standards of performance during term of the Agreement:
 - A. *Timeliness of Work.* Standard: Work is provided on schedule.
 - B. *Quality of Work.* Standard: Work conforms to the requirements of the Agreement and is technically accurate.
 - C. *Subcontract Activities.* Standard: Subrecipient's subcontract or subgrant activities comply with all H-GAC Agreement requirements regarding subcontracts, including: competitive procurement methods for goods and services, use of required subcontract provisions, and monitoring performance of subcontractors and sub performing parties.
 - D. *Administrative and Financial Operations.* Standards: Subrecipient's administrative and financial operations comply with all obligations in law and in the contract especially record-keeping, reimbursement requests, audits, allowable costs, and restricted expenditures.
 - E. *Performance Measures.* H-GAC will monitor Subrecipient's performance and evaluate the level of compliance with the standards utilizing the following performance measures:
 - Satisfactory:* Subrecipient generally complied with the standard consistently; occasional deficiencies may have occurred which were corrected on a timely basis.
 - Unsatisfactory:* Significant deficiencies have occurred, or Subrecipient frequently or substantially failed to comply with the standard.
2. *Schedule of Remedies.* The following Schedule of Remedies applies to this contract in the event of substandard performance or other failure to conform to the requirements of the contract or applicable law as set forth in this Section.
 - A. Reject substandard performance and request corrections without charge to H-GAC.
 - B. Issue notice of substandard performance or other non-conforming act or omission.
 - C. Request and receive return of any over payments or inappropriate payments.
 - D. Reject reimbursement request and suspend payment pending accepted revision of substandard performance or non-conformity.
 - E. Suspend all or part of the work and/or payments pending accepted revision of substandard performance or non-conformity.

F. Reject reimbursement requested and withhold all or partial payments. Funds may be retained by H-GAC for recovery of administrative costs or returned to funding source as authorized by agreements with the funding source and by state or federal law.

G. Terminate the contract, demand and receive: return of all equipment purchased with contract funds, return of all unexpended funds, and repayment of expended funds.

If a H-GAC evaluation finds Subrecipient's performance to be substandard, H-GAC may provide its written evaluation report to other governmental entities at any time. H-GAC may also provide its written evaluation report to the public as authorized by law.

3. *Cumulative Remedies.* H-GAC may avail itself of any remedy or sanction provided in this Agreement or in law to recover any losses arising from or caused by the Subrecipient substandard performance or any non-conformity with the Agreement or the law. The remedies and sanctions available to H-GAC in this Agreement shall not limit the remedies available to Subrecipient under law. Should H-GAC require repayment from Subrecipient, failure to pay within 30 days of a formal demand, shall result in legal actions to recover such funds, other sanctions as set forth in these Special Provisions, and additional costs billable to Subrecipient, including allowable interest and attorney's fees.

ARTICLE 8: AUDIT

- A. The Subrecipient shall have an audit performed in accordance with the Single Audit requirements of the most recently adopted Texas Grant Management Standards (TxGMS) and 2 CFR Part 200, if applicable, for any of its fiscal years in which Subrecipient expends more than \$750,000 in state or federal financial assistance.
- B. The Subrecipient will provide H-GAC a copy of the single audit, including management letter and reporting package required by federal and state rules, within thirty (30) days after receipt of the auditor's report, or nine (9) months after the end of the audit period.
- C. H-GAC reserves the right to conduct, or cause to be conducted, an independent audit of all funds distributed under this Agreement. This independent audit may be performed by the local government audit staff, a certified public accountant firm, or other auditors as designated by H-GAC. Such audit will be conducted in accordance with state law, regulations, policy, and generally accepted auditing standards of the auditing agency.
- D. The Subrecipient understands and agrees that the Subrecipient shall be liable to H-GAC for any costs disallowed or overpayment discovered as a result of audit or inspection of records kept by the Subrecipient, on work performed under this Agreement.
- E. The Subrecipient agrees to cooperate with any monitoring, inspection, audit, or investigation of activities related to this Agreement. Cooperation may include access to the premises for questioning employees or participants and to examine and/or photocopy any books, records, including participant records, papers, or other documents whatsoever.
- F. H-GAC shall provide technical assistance in correcting deficiencies noted. H-GAC may conduct follow-up visits to review the previous deficiencies and to assess the efforts made to correct them.
- G. The Subrecipient shall furnish H-GAC with a copy of the annual audit report, to include data fully compliant with The American Institute of CPAs Statement of Position 89-6, dated August 11, 1989.

ARTICLE 9: AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES

H-GAC will designate specific employees, authorized to discuss matters relating to this Agreement, or provide additional written guidance, clarification, or technical direction. "Technical direction" means information or specific instructions related to the operation of services and Scope of Work under this Agreement. Authorized representatives are identified in Attachment D to this agreement.

This Whole Agreement as written supersedes any and all prior oral and written agreements between the parties relating to matters herein, and cannot be modified by any representative, without the executed written memorialization of consent of the parties.

ARTICLE 10: COST PRINCIPLES; ACCOUNTING SYSTEMS

Subrecipient shall comply with applicable administrative requirements set forth in either the Office of Management and Budget's Uniform Administrative Requirements 2 CFR 200, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (Uniform Guidance) 48 CFR, Chapter I, Part 31, or the final rules promulgated by the Texas Office of the Governor under the Uniform Grant and Contract Management Standards (UGCMS) Tex. Gov't Code § 783 whichever is applicable.

Subrecipient shall have an accounting system which accounts for costs in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and complies with applicable State law, regulations, and policies relating to accounting standards or principles. Subrecipient shall account for costs related to this Agreement, in a manner consistent with such standards or principles.

ARTICLE 11: INSURANCE

H-GAC acknowledges that Subrecipient is governed by the Texas Tort Claims Act, which sets forth certain limitations and restrictions on the types of liability and the types of insurance coverage that can be required of Subrecipient. The Subrecipient represents to H-GAC that it either has adequate General Liability and Property insurance policies in place or sufficient resources to self-insure for all claims for which it may be responsible under the Texas Tort Claims Act. The Subrecipient further represents to H-GAC that it either has workers' compensation insurance in the amount required by statute or is entitled to self-insure for workers' compensation coverage under the Texas law and has elected to do so.

ARTICLE 12: SUBCONTRACTS

Except as may be set forth in the Scope of Work, the Subrecipient agrees not to subcontract, assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of the agreement or any right, title, obligation or interest it may have therein to any third party without prior written approval of H-GAC.

Should the Scope of Work allow subcontracting, Subrecipient acknowledges that H-GAC is not liable to any subcontractor(s) of the Subrecipient.

The Subrecipient shall ensure that the performance rendered under all subcontracts shall result in compliance with all the terms and provisions of this agreement as if the performance rendered was performed by Subrecipient.

ARTICLE 13: PREVENTION OF FRAUD, ABUSE, AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Subrecipient shall establish and implement reasonable internal procedures and management controls to prevent misuse of funds under this contract. Subrecipient agrees to report, in writing, to H-GAC any knowledge of suspected fraud, program abuse, possible illegal expenditures, unlawful activity, and violations of federal or state policies and procedures within 24 hours of discovery. Except as provided by law or court order, the parties to this agreement will ensure the confidentiality of all incident reports. Neither Subrecipient nor H-GAC will retaliate against any person filing an incident report. Any failure to comply with this Article will result in H-GAC utilizing the Schedule of Remedies as defined in this agreement.

Subrecipient shall take every reasonable course of action to maintain the integrity of the expenditure of public funds under this Agreement, avoiding favoritism and questionable or

improper conduct. This Agreement shall be administered in an impartial manner, free from efforts to gain personal, financial, or political benefit, tangible or intangible. Subrecipient and its executive staff and employees, shall avoid situations that could give the appearance that any decision was influenced by prejudice, bias, special interest, or desire for personal gain.

ARTICLE 14: OWNERSHIP OF MATERIALS

Subrecipient shall report to H-GAC promptly in writing, any patent or copyright infringement notice or claim, related in any way to this Agreement or the performance thereof.

Under this Agreement, to the extent permitted by law, Subrecipient shall indemnify H-GAC and its officers, agents and employees against liability, including costs, for infringement of any United States patent arising out of: the manufacture or delivery of supplies, the performance of services, the construction, alteration, modification, use, disposal or repair of real property, supplies, or construction work by or for H-GAC.

Pursuant to 2 CFR 200.315, in the case of any invention, any data, or any recorded information or media resulting from this Agreement in which Subrecipient retains title, H-GAC shall have an immediate, non-exclusive, nontransferable, worldwide, irrevocable, paid-up license to utilize and practice the subject invention. H-GAC's license shall include the rights to reproduce, prepare derivative works, distribute copies to the public, perform publicly and display publicly, by or on behalf of H-GAC.

In addition to the above, this agreement incorporates the standards set forth in the "Texas Grants Management Standards (TxGMS), relating to title to and management of real property and equipment. Additional information can be found at: <https://comptroller.texas.gov/purchasing/grant-management/>.

ARTICLE 15: HISTORICALLY UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES (HUBS)

Subrecipient agrees that qualified Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUBs) shall have the maximum practicable opportunity to participate in the performance of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 16: PERMITS AND APPROVALS

The Subrecipient shall obtain applicable drawing and specification approvals and permits from government authorities and governing bodies as may be required for the design and completion of the work under this agreement as identified in the Attachment C to this agreement. All changes that may be required to the specifications or drawings, or actions necessary to obtain governmental approval, are within the scope of this Agreement.

Subrecipient shall obtain and pay for all construction permits and licenses, including charges of utility owners for connections to the work, and capital costs related thereto, such as plant investment fees.

ARTICLE 17: PERSONNEL

Subrecipient shall employ qualified staff members, including a Project Manager, who shall be responsible for the task administration and work performance. In the event the original Project Manager is no longer available to this project, a substitution of like personnel with similar qualifications can be made after obtaining prior written approval of H-GAC.

Subrecipient shall ensure that any personnel or skilled labors involved in the completion of that Scope of Work, including design, architectural, structural, mechanical, electrical, civil, or other engineering roles, is properly licensed and registered to practice in the State of Texas.

ARTICLE 18: ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF FUNDING SOURCE

The Subrecipient shall give credit to H-GAC and appropriate state or federal funding agency, as the

funding source in all oral presentations, written documents, publicity, news media, and advertisements regarding any of the Subrecipient's activities which arise from this Agreement. Reports, webpages, or any other documents or materials completed by Subrecipient as part of this Agreement shall be submitted, in advance of publishing, to H-GAC's authorized representative for approval.

ARTICLE 19: HEALTH, SAFETY, AND PROTECTION

The Subrecipient shall place the highest priority on health and safety and shall maintain a safe working environment during performance of the Work. Subrecipient shall comply, and shall secure compliance by its employees, agents, and subcontractors, with all applicable environmental, health, safety and security laws and regulations, and performance conditions in this Agreement. Compliance with such requirements shall represent the minimum standard required of Subrecipient.

Subrecipient shall be responsible for examining all requirements and determine whether additional or more stringent environmental, health, safety and security provisions are required for the Work. Subrecipient agrees to utilize protective devices as required by applicable laws, regulations, and any industry or Subrecipient's health and safety plans and regulations, and to pay the costs and expenses thereof, and warrants that all such persons shall be fit and qualified to carry out the Work.

ARTICLE 20: ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION & HAZARDOUS WASTE

Subrecipient shall not, and shall not permit any of its Subsidiaries to, directly or indirectly (a) use (or permit any tenant to use) any of their respective properties or assets for the handling, processing, storage, transportation, or disposal of any Hazardous Material, (b) generate any Hazardous Material in violation of Environmental Laws, (c) conduct any activity that is likely to cause a Release or threatened Release of any Hazardous Material in violation of Environmental Laws, or (d) otherwise conduct any activity or use any of their respective Properties or assets in any manner that is likely to violate any Environmental Law or create any Environmental Liabilities for which Subrecipient or any of its Subsidiaries would be responsible.

ARTICLE 21: INFORMATION RESOURCES SECURITY POLICY

Subrecipient shall maintain a written information security policy, which at minimum:

- 1) ensures that all Subrecipient's employees and Subrecipient's subcontractor's employees shall complete a cybersecurity training program certified under section 2054.519 of the Texas Government Code. Such training must occur during the contract term and renewal period. Subrecipient shall provide Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym with verification of required training upon completion and Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym's request;
- 2) provides regular training of all Subrecipient's employees and Subrecipient's subcontractor's employees on applicable and up to date security procedures and techniques;
- 3) requires that Subrecipient and Subrecipient subcontractors maintain privacy policies that protect private data as prescribed by applicable state, local, federal privacy laws and regulations; and,
- 4) requires that Subrecipient and Subrecipient's subcontractors utilize adequate safeguards to address any security vulnerabilities.

Upon request, Subrecipient shall provide Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym with a copy of Subrecipient and Subrecipient's subcontractor's written information security policies.

ARTICLE 22: ACCESS AND PROTECTIONS OF Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym INFORMATION RESOURCES, DATA, AND CREDENTIALS

Subrecipient is responsible for, must protect, and shall provide adequate safeguards against any unauthorized use, modification, or disclosure of Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym information resources, data, and credentials. Subrecipient and Subrecipient subcontractors shall stay up to date and aware of current, ongoing, and potential telecommunications security risks in Subrecipient and Subrecipient subcontractors given environment(s) and must always consider information sensitivity and transmission security issues when selecting a communications medium.

Subrecipient and Subrecipient subcontractors are required to utilize up-to-date and adequate anti-virus or malware protection software for all systems and devices used to access Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym information resources, data, and credentials. Subrecipient is responsible for any incident arising from improperly protected Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym information resources, data, and credentials.

ARTICLE 23: SECURITY BREACH

Subrecipient shall notify Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym within 24 (twenty-four) hours of Subrecipient's discovery of a security incident, breach, or unauthorized use, modification, or disclosure of Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym information resources, data, or credentials. Hereinafter, such an event will be referred to as a "security breach" in this section. Upon immediate discovery of security breach, Subrecipient will coordinate with Houston-Galveston Area Council acronym to determine and implement an adequate and timely action plan to mitigate security breach and resolve any issues resulting from security breach. Subrecipient shall bear all associated costs for any security breach caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of the Subrecipient and Subrecipient's subcontractors.

Project Description: Walker County will be using grant funds to hold a collection event for the County residents to collect trash and recyclables.

Task I: Get Agreements with Vendors in Place

Activity and/or Deliverable – Negotiate with dumpster rental company for planning and coordination of event and recycling/disposal.

Schedule of Activity and/or Deliverable (in weeks or months) – 1-2 months.

Task II: Select Date and Location for Collection Event and Submit to H-GAC

Activity and/or Deliverable – The County will select date and location for collection event. The County will forward collection event info to H-GAC.

Schedule of Activity and/or Deliverable (in weeks or months) - 3 ½ months prior to event

Task III: Publicize Event

Activity and/or Deliverable – The County will coordinate collection event promotion through door hangers to include collection event details. All must be approved by H-GAC prior to being printed or submitted to the vendor.

Schedule of Activity and/or Deliverable (in weeks or months) – Begin as soon as grant funds are available.

Task IV: Prepare for Collection Events

Activity and/or Deliverable – The County will handle all preparations for collection events. The County will arrange a meeting with stakeholders on site to review final plan. The County will notify hospitals, and adjacent businesses regarding the event. Logistics of collection will be forwarded on to H-GAC.

Schedule of Activity and/or Deliverable (in weeks or months) - 2 months to 2 weeks prior to event.

Task V: Hold Collection Event

Activity and/or Deliverable – The County will hold one-day collection event. The County will be responsible for registering the volunteers and setting up the rest area. The County will oversee the traffic control. The County will also be responsible for the unloading of collected materials.

Schedule of Activity and/or Deliverable (in weeks or months) - Collection Day.

Task VI: Progress Reporting

Activity and/or Deliverable – Progress Reports will be submitted to H-GAC. H-GAC will provide the appropriate reporting forms. Forms must be submitted even if there is no activity to report. Follow-up report will be submitted at a later date to be determined.

March 10, 2023 (November – February)

June 10, 2023 (March – May)
July 30, 2023 (June)
Follow Up Report – September 2024

Schedule of Activity and/or Deliverable (in weeks or months) – As scheduled above. If the due date falls on a weekend or holiday the report is due the following business day.

Task VII: Financial Reporting

Activity and/or Deliverable - Financial reporting with appropriate documentation will be submitted monthly to H-GAC for reimbursement. H-GAC will provide the appropriate financial forms. Forms must be submitted even if no reimbursement is requested.

Schedule of Activity and/or Deliverable (in weeks or months) – Monthly on the 10th. Preliminary final reimbursement request is also due on the 10th while the official final reimbursement request is due 30 days after grant termination. If the 10th day of the month falls on a weekend or holiday the report is due the following business day.

Task VIII: Additional Reporting

Activity and/or Deliverable – The County will respond to surveys and/or other requests from H-GAC or TCEQ for information on municipal solid waste management activities.

SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING STANDARDS

In addition to the standards set forth in applicable laws and regulations, as well as the category-specific funding limitations, the standards outlined below apply to all uses of the FY 2020/2021 solid waste grant funds.

1. **Payment of Fees.** Local and regional political subdivisions subject to the payment of state solid waste disposal fees and whose payments are in arrears are not eligible to receive grant funding.
2. **Municipal Solid Waste-Related Programs Only.** Funds may not be used for programs dealing with wastes that are not considered MSW, including programs dealing with industrial or hazardous wastes.
3. **Activities Related to the Disposal of Municipal Solid Waste.** Except as may be specifically authorized under an eligible project category, funds may not be used for activities related to the disposal of MSW. This restriction includes: solid waste collection and transportation to a disposal facility; waste combustion (incineration or waste-to-energy); processing for reducing the volume of solid waste which is to be disposed of; any landfill-related facilities or activities, including the closure and post-closure care of a landfill; or other activities and facilities associated with the ultimate disposal of MSW. This provision does not apply to activities specifically included under an authorized project category.
4. **Projects Requiring a TCEQ Permit.** Funds may not be used for expenses related to projects or facilities that require a permit from the TCEQ and/or that are located within the boundaries of a permitted facility, including landfills, wastewater treatment plants, and other facilities. This provision, however, may be waived by the TCEQ, at its discretion, for otherwise eligible activities to be located at a closed permitted facility and/or for recycling activities that will take place within the boundaries of an open facility. Recycling activities that may qualify for such a waiver may include recyclables collection, composting, and land application of bio-solids for beneficial use. The applicant and/or H-GAC will request a preliminary determination from the TCEQ as to the eligibility of the project prior to consideration for funding.
5. **Projects Requiring TCEQ Registration.** Projects or facilities that require registration from the TCEQ, and which are otherwise eligible for funding, may be funded. However, the registration for the facility must be finally received before that project can be selected for funding.
6. **Projects that Create a Competitive Advantage Over Private Industry.** In accordance with §361.014(b) of the Texas Health and Safety Code, a project or service funded under this program must promote cooperation between public and private entities and may not be otherwise readily available or create a competitive advantage over a private industry that provides recycling or solid waste services. Under this definition, the term “private industry” includes non-profit entities.

7. **Supplanting Existing Funds.** Funds may not be used to supplant existing funds. In particular, staff positions where the functions assigned to that position will remain the same, were active at the time of the grant application and were funded from a source other than a previous solid waste grant, are not eligible for grant funding.
8. **Land Acquisition Costs.** Funds may not be used to acquire land or an interest in land.
9. **Real Property and Equipment.** In accordance with §361.014(b) of the Texas Health and Safety Code, the use of real property and equipment funded under this program must promote cooperation between public and private entities and may not be otherwise readily available or create a competitive advantage over a private industry that provides recycling or solid waste services. Under this definition, the term “private industry” includes non-profit entities.
10. **State Contracts.** Funds may not be provided through an implementation project grant or subcontract to any public or private entity that is barred from participating in state contracts by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts, under the provisions of §2155.077, Government Code.
11. **Safety and Protection.** Where applicable, the CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for requiring subcontractors and subgrantees to maintain and supervise all necessary safety precautions and programs in connection with the work. The CONTRACTOR shall take all necessary safety precautions.
12. **Intended Purpose.** All equipment and facilities purchased or constructed with funds provided under this program shall be used for the purposes intended in the funding agreement.
13. **Consistency with Regional Solid Waste Management Plan.** A project or service funded under this program must be consistent with H-GAC’s approved regional solid waste management plan, and must be intended to implement the goals, objectives, and priorities established in the regional plan.
14. **Lobbyists.** Funds may not be used for employment or contracts for services of a lobbyist or for dues to an organization that employs or otherwise contracts for the services of a lobbyist.
15. **Enforcement Actions.** Funds may not be used to assist an entity or individual to comply with an existing or pending federal, state, or local judgment or enforcement action. This restriction includes assistance to an entity to comply with an order to clean up and/or remediate problems at an illegal dumpsite. However, the TCEQ may waive this restriction, at its discretion and on a limited case-by-case basis, to address immediate threats to human health or the environment, and where it is demonstrated that the responsible party does not have the resources to comply with the order.
16. **Penalties.** Funds may not be used to pay penalties imposed on an entity for violation of federal, state, or local laws and regulations. This restriction includes expenses for conducting a supplemental environmental project (SEP) under a federal or state order or penalty. Funds may be used in conjunction with SEP funds to support the same project.

CATEGORY-SPECIFIC FUNDING LIMITATIONS

The following project categories are eligible for funding. Under each category heading is a brief description of the purpose of that category, as well as special requirements pertaining to that project category.

Category 1. Local Enforcement

This category consists of projects that contribute to the prevention of illegal dumping of municipal solid waste, including liquid wastes. Under this category, grant recipients may investigate illegal dumping problems; enforce laws and regulations pertaining to the illegal dumping of municipal solid waste, including liquid waste; establish a program to monitor the collection and transport of municipal liquid wastes through administration of a manifesting system; and educate the public on illegal dumping laws and regulations. Funding limitations applicable to this category include:

- As provided by the General Appropriations Act (85th Leg. R.S.), funds may not be expended to any law enforcement agency regulated by Chapter 1701, Texas Occupations Code, unless: (a) the law enforcement agency is in compliance with all rules on Law Enforcement Standards and Education; or (b) the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education certifies that the requesting agency is in the process of achieving compliance with such rules.
- When funding is to be provided for salaries of local enforcement officers, the funds recipient must certify that at least one of the officers has attended or will attend within the term of the funding the TCEQ's Criminal Environmental Law Enforcement Training or equivalent training.
- Local enforcement vehicles and related enforcement equipment purchased entirely with funds provided under this program may only be used for activities to enforce laws and regulations pertaining to littering and illegal dumping, and may not be used for other code enforcement or law enforcement activities. Vehicles and equipment that are only partially funded must be dedicated for use in local enforcement activities for a percentage of time equal to the proportion of the purchase expense funded.
- Entities receiving funds for a local enforcement officer, enforcement vehicles, and/or related equipment for use by an enforcement officer, must investigate major illegal dumping problems, on both public and private property, in addition to investigating general litter problems on public property.
- Entities receiving funds to conduct a local enforcement program must cooperate with the TCEQ's regional investigative staff in identifying and investigating illegal dumping problems. Lack of cooperation with the TCEQ staff may constitute a reason to withhold future funding to that entity for local enforcement activities.
- Funds may not be used for investigation and enforcement activities related to the illegal dumping of industrial and/or hazardous waste. Instances where industrial or hazardous waste is discovered at a site do not preclude the investigation of that site, so long as the intent and focus of the investigation and enforcement activities are on the illegal dumping of municipal solid waste.
- Grant funds may not be used for either the cleanup of illegal disposal sites or the transportation and/or disposal of wastes collected during such cleanups.
- Funds may not be used for purchase of weapons, ammunition, and/or HazMat gear.

Category 2. Litter and Illegal Dumping Cleanup and Community Collection Events

Litter and illegal dumping cleanup may include both ongoing and periodic activities to clean up litter and illegal dumping of MSW, excluding cleanup of scrap tire dumping sites. Projects under this category may support Lake and River Cleanup events, conducted in conjunction with the TCEQ's and Keep Texas Beautiful's Lake and River Cleanup program. Eligible expenses include waste removal, recycling of removed materials, fencing and barriers, and signage. Placement of trash collection receptacles in public areas with chronic littering problems may also be funded. Reuse or recycling options should be considered for managing the materials collected through these efforts, to the extent feasible. Cleanup of hazardous waste will not be eligible for funding.

Periodic community collection events to provide for collection of residential waste materials for which there is not a readily available collection alternative may also be funded. This type of project may not include regular solid waste collection efforts, such as weekly waste collection. Funds may not be used for the disposal of collected wastes.

Funding limitations applicable to this category include:

- Lake and River Cleanup events must be coordinated with the TCEQ's cleanup program staff and/or the Keep Texas Beautiful organization, which is contracted by the TCEQ to administer the Lake and River Cleanup program.
- Projects funded to clean up litter or illegal dumping on private property must be conducted through a local government sponsor or H-GAC. Funds may not be provided directly to a private landowner or other private responsible party for cleanup expenses. The local government sponsor or H-GAC must either contract for and oversee the cleanup work, or conduct the work with its own employees and equipment.
- The costs for cleanup of hazardous waste that may be found at a municipal solid waste site must be funded from other sources, unless a waiver from this restriction is granted by the TCEQ to deal with immediate threats to human health or the environment.
- The costs for cleanup of Class 1 nonhazardous industrial waste that may be found at a municipal solid waste site must be funded from other sources unless a waiver from this restriction is granted by the TCEQ to deal with immediate threats to human health or the environment. The cleanup of Class 2 and 3 nonhazardous industrial waste that may be found at a municipal solid waste site may be funded in conjunction with the cleanup of the municipal solid waste found at a site.
- All notification, assessment, and cleanup requirements pertaining to the release of wastes or other chemicals of concern, as required under federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including 30 TAC Chapter 330, TCEQ's MSW Regulations, and 30 TAC Chapter 350, TCEQ's Risk Reduction Regulations, must be complied with as part of any activities funded under this program.
- All materials cleaned up using funds provided under this program must be properly disposed of or otherwise properly managed in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. To the extent feasible, it is recommended that materials removed from a site be reused or recycled. For projects to clean up large amounts of materials, H-GAC will consider withholding at least ten percent (10%) of the reimbursements under an implementation project grant or subcontract, until

documentation is provided that the cleanup work has been completed and the materials properly managed.

- Funded community collection events may be held no more frequently than four times per year, and must only be intended to provide residents an opportunity to dispose of hard-to-collect materials, such as large and bulky items (eg: large appliances and electronics) that are not picked up under the regular collection system, and might otherwise be illegally dumped by residents.

Category 3. Source Reduction and Recycling

This category may include projects that are intended to provide a direct and measurable effect on reducing the amount of MSW going into landfills, by diverting materials from the MSW disposal stream for recycling or reuse, or by reducing waste generation at the source. Funded activities may include: diversion from the waste stream and/or collection, processing for transport, and transportation of materials for reuse and/or recycling; implementation of efficiency improvements in order to increase source reduction and recycling, to include full-cost accounting systems and cost-based rate structures, establishment of a solid waste services enterprise fund, and mechanisms to track and assess the level of recycling activity in the community on a regular basis; and educational and promotional activities to increase source reduction and recycling.

Funding limitations applicable to this category include:

- Any program or project funded under this program with the intent of demonstrating the use of products made from recycled and/or reused materials shall have as its primary purpose the education and training of residents, governmental officials, private entities, and others to encourage a market for using these materials.

Category 4. Local Solid Waste Management Plans

This category includes projects to develop and/or amend local solid waste management plans by local governments, in accordance with Subchapter D, Chapter 363, Texas Health & Safety Code, as implemented by state rule, Subchapter O, 30 TAC Chapter 330. In selecting a local solid waste management plan project for funding, H-GAC shall ensure that at least one year is available for the completion and adoption of the local plan.

Funding limitations applicable to this category include:

- All local solid waste management plans funded under this program must be consistent with H-GAC regional solid waste management plan and prepared in accordance with 30 TAC Subchapter O, Chapter 330, TCEQ Regulations, and the Content and Format Guidelines provided by the TCEQ.

Category 5. Citizens' Collection Stations and "Small" Registered Transfer Stations

Funds may be used for projects to construct and equip citizens' collection stations, as these facilities are defined under 30 TAC §330.3, TCEQ Regulations. Projects funded for these types of facilities shall include consideration of an integrated approach to solid waste management, to include providing recycling services at the site, if appropriate to the management system in place. The following MSW facilities may qualify on a case by case basis for funding:

- Notification tier municipal solid waste transfer stations that qualify under 30 TAC 330.11(g).
- Registered municipal solid waste transfer stations that qualify under 30 TAC 330.9(b)(1) through (3), or (f).
- Notification tier citizens' collection stations that qualify under 30 TAC 330.11(e)(1).
- Exempt local government recycling facilities as provided for under 30 TAC 328.4(a)(1).
- Notification tier recycling facilities that qualify under 30 TAC 330.11(e)(2).
- Notification tier composting facilities which qualify under 30 TAC 332.21 – 332.23.
- Notification tier liquid waste temporary storage facilities which qualify under 30 TAC 330.11(e)(5).
- Liquid waste transfer stations which qualify for registration in 30 TAC 330.9(g) and (o).
- Notification tier used oil collection facilities which qualify under 30 TAC 324.7(1) or (3).

Category 6. Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

This category includes projects that provide a means for the collection, recycling, reuse, and/or proper disposal of HHW, including household chemicals, used oil and oil filters, antifreeze, lead-acid batteries, and other materials. This category does not include programs and facilities for collecting, recycling, or disposing of scrap tires, except as may be an ancillary part of the overall program or facility. Funded activities can include: collection events; consolidation and transportation costs associated with collection activities; recycling or reuse of materials; proper disposal of materials; permanent collection facilities, and education and public awareness programs.

Funding limitations applicable to this category include:

- All HHW collection, recycling, and/or disposal activities must be coordinated with the TCEQ's HHW program staff, and all applicable laws, regulations, guidelines, and reporting requirements must be followed.
- First-time applicants may request funds for disposal costs. Second and subsequent year requests will be considered at the discretion of the Solid Waste Management Committee (SWMC).

Category 7. Technical Studies

This category includes projects for the collection of pertinent data, analysis of issues and needs, evaluation of alternative solutions, public input, and recommended actions, to assist in making solid waste management decisions at the local or regional level. Projects under this category may also include research and investigations to determine the location, boundaries, and contents of closed municipal solid waste landfills and sites, and to assess possible risks to human health or the environment associated with those landfills and sites.

Funding limitations applicable to this category include:

- All technical studies funded under this program must be consistent with H-GAC's regional solid waste management plan, and prepared in accordance with guidelines provided by the TCEQ.

Category 8. Educational and Training Projects

This category is intended for educational projects or training events dealing with a variety of MSW management topics. This category does not include the educational components of projects funded under the other categories.

Funding limitations applicable to this category include:

- Educational and training programs and projects funded under this program must be primarily related to the management of municipal solid waste, and funds applied to a broader education program may only be used for those portions of the program pertaining to municipal solid waste.

Category 9. Other Types of Projects

Other types of projects, not specifically prohibited from funding under the more detailed funding standards and restrictions, may be considered by H-GAC on a case-by-case basis.

The CONTRACTOR Project Representative shall be deemed to have authority to bind the CONTRACTOR in Agreement unless the CONTRACTOR, in writing, specifically limits or denies such authority to the CONTRACTOR Project Representative.
- C. Either party may change its Project Representative. In addition, the Project Representative of either party may further delegate his or her authority as necessary, including any delegation of authority to a new Project Representative. The party making the change in Project Representative shall provide written notice of the change to the other party.
- D. The CONTRACTOR shall ensure that its Project Representative, or his or her delegate, is available at all times for consultation with H-GAC.

Project Merits and Needs

Need for Project (15 Points)

The two neighborhoods have long suffered from illegal littering, trash from abandoned structures, and as dumping locations for large items like sofas, appliances, and even cars. As the County Commissioner, I have seen a change in the attitudes of both of these areas. The residents want the area cleaned up and are willing to help make it happen. In speaking with them over the past few months the idea of a neighborhood cleanup event was brought forth and received very enthusiastically.

Both the neighborhoods adjoin the Trinity River and Lake Livingston. dumped or improperly disposed of items clog drainage ways causing water to stand, harbor rodents and other pest animals and vectors, and leached pollutants will discharge directly into the river and lake, which is used for both drinking water and recreation by residents from Walker County all the way to discharge point at the Gulf of Mexico.

Objective (5 Points)

Collect as much trash and recyclables as possible within the 6 hour collection period by:
Establishing a collection day for each neighborhood, probably in the early fall when it cools a bit.
Dispersing educational materials to the residents via Facebook pages, door hangars, signs
Emphasizing the importance of neighborhood cleanliness

Project Feasibility (15 Points)

The enthusiastic response from the residents with which I have spoken makes me very confident that this event will be very successful in cleaning up and reducing the trash dumping problem in the two neighborhoods. My crews will be at each location helping anyone who needs it to collect and load their trash. Our door hangars will encourage neighbors to work together to at least get their trash out to the street if they cannot haul it to our dumpster so that we can come by and pick it up for them.

The logistics of the project are fairly simple, and I have the manpower and equipment to ensure that this project will be a success.

Ability to Sustain Project (15 Points)

It is not anticipated that this one event will solve the problems that have been in place for several years. It is, however, anticipated that the willingness of the County to assist by bringing the collection station to their neighborhood and being a part of the clean up will help to rebuild the pride of the residents and that they will continue their clean up efforts.

Also, once the event is completed the County Environmental Officer will be visiting with residents that still have trash and disposal problems and will "encourage" them to clean their areas.

Matching Funds or In-Kind Services (5 Points)

The County will provide at least 5 employees at overtime rates, dump trucks, backhoes, pickup trucks, and other equipment as needed to ensure that the event will be a success. The labor and fuel cost will be in excess of \$1,200. The cost for the equipment will vary, depending upon how much is needed at the events, but will also be in excess of \$1,000 over each 6 hour event.

Partnerships (5 Points)

These projects are direct partnerships with the residents of the two neighborhoods. They will be the ones cleaning, stacking, hauling, and disposing of their trash as they clean their properties. My role as the county will be to collect and dispose of the material. It is a true partnership between the folks that want to clean it up and me being the one to haul it off.

Project Evaluation

Return on Investment (15 Points)

As stated before, the neighborhoods adjoin Lake Livingston and the Trinity River. Pollutants that leech into the environment will discharge directly into those bodies of water, which is used as a drinking water source and for recreation from Walker County all the way to the discharge point at the Gulf of Mexico. Removing the pollutants reduces the contaminated runoff, which will help to keep the waterbodies clean. Once cleaned, the ditches will allow for water to drain from the neighborhood, reducing mosquitos, flies, rodents, and other vectors.

This project will positively impact two neighborhoods that are attempting to rebuild themselves. Residents want to clean up, and I am confident they will keep it cleaner if given the head start provided by this clean up day.

Anticipated Effectiveness (10 Points)

I am anticipating a big response from the residents. I have had numerous requests for clean up assistance, and I think the residents will want to be a part of making their neighborhood look better. There are a couple residents that have offered to assist others in collecting, and my crews will be driving the streets with heavy equipment picking up what we see and what residents have deposited on the edge of the road.

Measures of Success (5 Points)

Full dumpsters! We will track the number of residents that contribute to the project. I am hoping that we see a participation rate of between 25% to 30% of the populations of each neighborhood. I have done clean up days in the past, and know from experience that getting more than 30% is difficult.

**PARTICIPATING ENTITY SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR THE
STATEWIDE AUTOMATED VICTIM NOTIFICATION SERVICE (SAVNS)**

Contract No. 20222344900 –516– 01

WHEREAS, the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) is the Texas State agency tasked with certifying a statewide vendor to provide a Statewide Automated Victim Notification Service (SAVNS) to a variety of political subdivisions of the State of Texas, including counties, county Sheriffs, clerks and attorneys, district attorneys, and courts (“Participating Entities”);

WHEREAS OAG solicited offers to perform the development, implementation and execution of a Statewide Automated Victim Notification System (SAVNS) on behalf of the various Participating Entities and accepted the offer of Appriss Inc. (“Original Entity”) in response to the Request for Offer (RFO) for SAVNS, **RFO #302-19-SAVNS, dated March 11, 2019;**

WHEREAS on or about October 1, 2021, Original Entity’s subsidiary, Appriss Insights, LLC (“Vendor”), was acquired by TALX Corporation and OAG Contract #2002525 was assigned to Vendor by Original Entity to continue to provide the SAVNS following the acquisition;

WHEREAS OAG has certified and contracted with the newly formed Vendor as the statewide vendor to provide SAVNS to each of the Participating Entities (“OAG Certification Agreement”) a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A;

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS CONTRACT is entered into by and between **Walker County, Texas** (“Named Entity”) as a Participating Entity and VENDOR. Named Entity and VENDOR may be referred to in this Contract (“Contract”) individually as “Party” or collectively as “Parties.” The Parties, in consideration of their respective promises, agreements, and covenants contained and recited herein, hereby agree to the mutual obligations and performances described in this Contract as follows:

SECTION 1: CONTRACT TERM. This Contract shall commence on September 1, 2022 or on the date the final signature is affixed hereto, whichever is later (“Effective Date”) and shall terminate on August 31, 2023 (“Initial Term”). This Contract may be renewed for one (1) additional one (1) year renewal term (“Renewal Term”), only to the extent the OAG Certification Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit A, remains in effect, and in the sole and absolute discretion of Named Entity. If renewed, any Renewal Term shall begin on September 1 and end on August 31, always coinciding with the State’s fiscal year. Each such Renewal Term shall be subject to all specifications and terms and conditions of this Contract, the OAG Certification Agreement, and the Incorporated Documents as defined in Section 2 below.

The Initial Term collectively with all Renewal Terms and all total extensions of services hereunder shall constitute the “Term” of the Agreement.

SECTION 2: CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

Vendor and Named Entity agree to be bound by the provisions contained in the following documents (“Incorporated Documents”), which describe the required performances in more detail and are incorporated by reference herein in their entirety in the following order of precedence:

1. Special Provisions and Negotiated Terms (“Special Provisions”) attached hereto and incorporated by reference;
2. This Contract;
3. OAG Certification Agreement including all attachments, and Addenda not attached hereto but known to and in the possession of both Parties and incorporated herein by reference;
4. Updated versions of the following forms as attached hereto and herein incorporated by reference:
(a) Form A: Execution of Offer and Vendor Assurances; (b) Form F HUB Subcontracting Plan;

- (c) Form G: Vendor Information Form; (d) Form H: Cloud Security Questionnaire; and Form I: Business Continuity/Disaster Recovery Questionnaire;
5. OAG Standard Terms and Conditions as attached to the RFO, not attached hereto but known to and in the possession of both Parties and incorporated herein by reference;
 6. The RFO #302-19-SAVNS, dated March 11, 2019 including all posted documents, attachments, and Addenda (“RFO”), not attached hereto but known to and in the possession of both Parties and incorporated herein by reference; and
 7. Vendor written response in submission to the RFO, as accepted, not attached hereto but known to and in the possession of both Parties and incorporated herein by reference (“Vendor Response”); however, the Vendor Response as incorporated herein shall be considered to exclude Table 8 of the Response (p. 31) and the Proposed Exceptions to Exhibit A, Exhibit B, and Exhibit C of the Response (pp. 35-125).

If there is, and to the extent of, any conflict between the Incorporated Documents, such conflict will be resolved according to the order of precedence as set forth above. Capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined shall have the same meaning as in the applicable Incorporated Document.

SECTION 3: SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY VENDOR.

3.1 **Project.** Vendor agrees to configure, operate, maintain, support and provide Named Entity access to the SAVNS system as set forth in the RFO and the Vendor Response, (collectively the “Scope of Work” or “SOW”) which shall meet all of the requirements set forth in Section 4 of the RFO and Section 2 of the OAG Certification Agreement, all in accordance with the requirements of the Incorporated Documents referenced in Section 2 (“Project”).

3.2 **Scope of Services.** This Project includes but is not limited to the following services (collectively the “Participating Entity Services”):

(a) **VINE® (Victim Information and Notification Everyday).** VINE makes it easy for victims and concerned citizens to obtain timely information about criminal cases and the custody status of offenders held in local jails or state prisons. There are two versions of VINE that are currently supported by the Vendor: “Classic VINE” and “Enhanced VINE.” Original Entity and now Vendor have been in the process of migrating states from the Classic VINE platform to the entirely new Enhanced VINE platform since 2016. Enhanced VINE offers a new experience, going beyond notifications, and facilitating a greater degree of information sharing between public servants, victims, and service providers. It offers a suite of new and augmented features, incorporating self-service functionality, and providing the end-user with the ability to select preferred pathways of communication. The new platform brings transformative benefits to victims and victim service providers alike. Vendor’s long-term plan is to migrate all states to the Enhanced VINE technology platform to better serve the growing needs of victims of crime, victim advocates, law enforcement and criminal justice professionals.

(b) **VINE® Courts.** VINE Courts is a fully automated service that keeps crime victims and criminal justice professionals informed regarding the progress of their court cases. Users can access court information around the clock by calling a toll-free telephone number or logging on to www.vinelink.com. They can also register to be notified by phone, e-mail, text message, or TTY about upcoming court and hearing dates related to criminal justice proceedings, cancellations, continuances, disposition changes, and other events.

(c) “VINE Software” means VINE® and VINE® Courts (as detailed above and within the Vendor Response), including all designs, documents, inventions, software, copyrightable material, patentable and unpatentable subject matter, and all modifications, improvements, upgrades and derivative works made thereto.

(d) Vendor shall provide Named Entity access to VINE® and VINE® Courts pursuant to the requirements of the Incorporated Documents and at the rate included in the Pricing Index, incorporated herein as Exhibit B, for the term of this Contract. Vendor shall ensure Named Entity has access to the Classic VINE Platform upon commencement of this Contract but shall migrate Named Entity to the Enhanced VINE platform

within the Term of this Contract pursuant to the schedule agreed by Vendor and OAG under the terms of the OAG Certification Agreement.

3.3 Ownership of Vendor Intellectual Property; Licenses. Vendor retains all ownership rights in the VINE Software and all documents, designs, inventions, copyrightable material, patentable and unpatentable subject matter and other tangible materials authored or prepared by the Vendor (the “Intellectual Property”) in connection with the Services. Vendor hereby grants the OAG during the term of this Agreement, a limited, non-exclusive, non-transferable, non-sublicensable license to use the VINE Software in connection with the provision by Vendor of the VINE Services for the OAG’s internal purposes only. Nothing herein shall grant the OAG a license to the source code of the VINE Software. Notwithstanding the foregoing, all documents, reports, plans, copyrightable material, patentable and unpatentable subject matter and other tangible materials authored or prepared by the Vendor and required to be delivered to OAG by the Incorporated Documents shall be subject to Article V of the OAG Standard Terms and Conditions.

SECTION 4: SCHEDULE

4.1 Time is of the Essence. Time is of the essence in rendering of Participating Entity Services required by this Contract.

4.2 Performance Schedule. The Project shall be performed by Vendor according to a schedule to be mutually agreed by the Parties (“Schedule”) which shall set forth the required delivery dates of each report, plan, or other deliverable as required by the Incorporated Documents.

SECTION 5: COMPENSATION AND INVOICING

5.1 Payments for Services Rendered. The Parties stipulate and agree that OAG is the statutory party charged with administering and providing grant funds to Participating Entities on a reimbursement basis for the Participating Entity Services rendered by the Vendor. Accordingly, OAG shall not be directly responsible for any payment to Vendor for Participating Entity Services provided to Named Entity hereunder. All payments for such Participating Entity Services shall be made by Named Entity in accordance with the agreed pricing index (“Agreed Pricing Index”) incorporated herein as Exhibit B and pursuant to the terms of this Contract.

5.2 Recurring Fees. The Parties stipulate and agree that the Named Entity’s total amount of compensation to be paid to Vendor in consideration of full, satisfactory performance of all Vendor’s duties, services and obligations as set forth in this Contract, shall be billed on a recurring quarterly basis, in accordance with the Agreed Pricing Index, and not to exceed **\$4,376.31** per calendar quarter. (“Quarterly Fee”).

5.3 Invoicing. The Participating Entity Services for the Project shall be performed for the Quarterly Fee, which will be billed and invoiced in accordance with the Agreed Pricing Index and pursuant to the terms of this Contract and the RFO. Invoices will contain all pertinent information such as this Contract number, the dates of Services rendered, and any outages or performances issues as identified in Section 7 of this Contract.

5.4 Invoice Submission. Prior to authorizing payment to Vendor, Named Entity shall evaluate Vendor’s performance using the performance standards set forth in the SOW. Vendor shall provide invoices for Participating Entity Services no later than the 15th day following the end of the prior billing quarter in which the Participating Entity Services are rendered. No payment whatsoever shall be made under this Contract without the prior submission of detailed, correct invoices. By submission of the invoices, Vendor is warranting the following: (1) its invoices have been carefully reviewed to ensure that all invoiced services have been performed or delivered; (2) that the Participating Entity Services have been performed in compliance with all terms of the Contract and Incorporated Documents; and (3) all relevant performance and deliverables associated with such invoice have been successfully completed, accepted and all supporting documentation is attached. Upon the request of Named Entity, Vendor agrees to submit any additional documentation or explanation Named Entity may reasonably require. Subject to the foregoing, Named Entity must make all payments in accordance with the Texas Prompt Payment Act.

5.5 Appropriated Funds. Payments under this Contract are subject to the availability of appropriated funds. Whereas OAG provides grant dollars to the Named Entity as a reimbursement of the Quarterly Fees due hereunder, Vendor acknowledges and agrees that payments for Participating Entity Services provided under this Contract are contingent upon OAG's receipt of funds appropriated by the Texas Legislature.

SECTION 6: ADDITIONAL SERVICES

6.1 Additional Services. Named Entity may require the Vendor to perform additional services from among the optional services that are set forth in the SOW which are not included in the Participating Entity Services required under this Contract ("Additional Services"). Vendor shall offer any such Additional Services at the same rate as proposed in Vendor's Pricing Submission as attached and incorporated into the Vendor's Response.

6.2 Additional Services to be Mutually Agreed. No work or services shall commence, or products provided, unless and until the applicable fees, and all other impacts on the Project and Schedule as specified by Vendor are mutually agreed upon, in writing, by Named Entity and Vendor. No Additional Services or any applicable fees associated therewith shall be deemed to modify this Contract or obligations between Named Entity and Vendor except to the extent the Additional Services are mutually agreed upon, in advance in writing, and by both Named Entity and Vendor.

6.3 Liability for Additional Services. Vendor acknowledges and agrees that any Additional Services provided under this Contract are the sole responsibility of Named Entity. Any grant dollars issued by the OAG to Named Entity shall be utilized solely as a reimbursement for the Quarterly Fees incurred for Vendor's provision of the Participating Entity Services. OAG grant funds may not be used or obligated for any Additional Services provided hereunder.

SECTION 7: PERFORMANCE REPORTING AND REMEDIES

7.1 Performance Reports.

7.1.1 Project(s) Reporting. Pursuant to Section 4.2 of this Contract, Named Entity and Vendor shall agree on a Schedule to perform the Project which shall set forth the dates of each report, plan, or other deliverable as required by the Incorporated Documents. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Vendor shall provide Named Entity and/or the OAG with monthly written progress reports ("Progress Reports") of the Project's performance, which shall, at minimum, identify any problems encountered or still outstanding with an explanation of the cause and resolution of the problem or how the problem will be resolved. Additional performance related measurables shall be agreed upon between Named Entity and Vendor. For the avoidance of doubt, Vendor shall only provide Progress Reports related to implementation of the Project or unique projects for Named Entity. Progress Reports shall not be required for any portion of the Project already implemented as of the Effective Date.

7.1.2 Service Reporting. Upon Named Entity's written request, the Vendor, shall provide a report that includes the following national platform data for the prior month: SAVNS system down time, including the SAVNS core system, interface services, and notification interfaces.

7.2 Performance Remedies. In the event the Participating Entity Services provided by Vendor hereunder do not maintain a reliable 99.9% uptime-performance each calendar month for the SAVNS core system, Named Entity interface services, and notification interfaces, the Named Entity may withhold any Quarterly Fee due to the Vendor funds under Section 5 of this Contract based on a pro-rata amount equal to the duration of the outage for any prior billing quarter. The amount of withholding shall be calculated on a proportional amount for all Participating Entity Services provided to Named Entity in the billing quarter in which the monthly 99.9% uptime-performance requirement was not met. Accordingly, any outage in any portion of the SAVNS core system, Named Entity interface services, and notification interfaces for registered parties, shall be counted against the 99.9% uptime performance requirement.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Vendor shall not be responsible due to any delay caused by, and shall not have its uptime-performance impacted by: schedule amendments requested by the OAG (including any requests of Named Entity and any third party vendors of the OAG or the Named Entity); delays as the result of activity that is the responsibility of the OAG; delays that are otherwise agreed upon by the parties; any other delay not specifically addressed herein but that is otherwise caused by the acts or omissions of the OAG, Named Entity or any third party vendors of the OAG and Named Entity; and any delays caused by a Force Majeure Event as defined in the Section 15.10 of the OAG Standard Terms and Conditions.

SECTION 8: WARRANTIES

8.1 Vendor Warranties. In addition to any warranty obligations in the Incorporated Documents, Vendor hereby represents and warrants:

- (a) that Vendor shall perform the Project with the professional skill and care ordinarily provided by comparable professionals in the same industry;
- (b) that each of the Vendor employees and agents assigned to perform Vendor's obligations under this Contract and Incorporated Documents, shall have the skill and training to perform the Project in accordance with the foregoing standard of care, and that all work shall be produced in a professional and workmanlike manner;
- (c) that the SAVNS system shall materially conform to the requirements as set forth in this Contract, and in the SOW and Incorporated Documents;
- (d) that all deliverables provided hereunder shall materially conform to the requirements as set forth in this Contract, and in the SOW and Incorporated Documents;
- (e) that all Project performance and deliverables provided under the Contract are, and will be, free of all liens, claims and other restrictions, and that Named Entity's use and possession of such deliverables will not violate the terms or conditions of any license, confidentiality agreement, non-competition agreement, employment agreement or any other agreement to which Vendor, its agents, officers, employees or subcontractors may be subject;
- (f) that Vendor has the right to develop and assign all ownership rights in the deliverables to OAG as contemplated under this Contract, free from infringement claims, free from violations of unfair competition law, and free from violations of any other contract or law; and
- (g) that Vendor will implement reasonable and appropriate measures to prevent unauthorized disclosure or exposure of Named Entity Protected Data during Vendor's performance of the Participating Entity Services due under this Contract and the Incorporated Documents.

These representations and warranties are essential and material to Named Entity's willingness to enter into this Contract.

8.2 Warranty of Law. Vendor warrants and represents that to the best of its knowledge: (i) Vendor has full authority to enter into this Contract and to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby and (ii) this Contract is not prohibited by any other agreement to which Vendor is a party or by which it may be bound (the "Legal Warranty"). In the event of a breach of the Legal Warranty, Vendor shall indemnify and hold harmless Named Entity from and against any and all losses, damages, causes of action, claims, demands, and expenses (including reasonable legal fees and expenses) incurred by Named Entity, directly arising out of or resulting from said breach.

SECTION 9: DATA PROTECTION AND INFORMATION SECURITY

9.1 Definitions. Capitalized terms used herein shall have the meanings set forth in this Section 9.

(a) “Authorized Employees” shall mean Vendor’s employees who have a need to know or otherwise access Named Entity Protected Data to enable Vendor to perform its obligations under this Contract or any of the Incorporated Documents.

(b) “Authorized Persons” shall mean (i) Authorized Employees; and (ii) Vendor’s contractors or agents, as each is specified on Exhibit C to this Contract who have a need to know or otherwise access Named Entity Protected Data to enable Vendor to perform its obligations under this Contract or any of the Incorporated Documents, and who are bound in writing by confidentiality obligations sufficient to protect Named Entity Protected Data in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract.

(c) “Named Entity Protected Data” shall mean all documents, reports, data, records, forms, and other materials obtained by Vendor from the Named Entity or is otherwise received by Vendor from any person or entity registered to receive notifications from the SAVNS system, as a result of providing the Participating Entity Services as required under this Contract or any of the Incorporated Documents which includes personally identifiable information, federal tax information, personal health information, criminal justice information, or any information that is classified as confidential or sensitive by federal or state law, by agency policy, or is defined as "Personal Identifying Information" under Texas Business and Commerce Code §521.002(a)(1) or "Sensitive Personal Information" as defined by Texas Business and Commerce Code §521.002(a)(2) or any other data or information which (i) has been marked as confidential by any party; (ii) whose confidential nature has been made known to the Vendor by the Named Entity or any individual registered to receive notifications under the SAVNS system; or (iii) that due to their character and nature, a reasonable person under like circumstances would treat as confidential.

(d) “Personal Identifiable Information” shall have the meaning set forth in Texas Business and Commerce Code §521.002(a)(1).

(e) “Named Entity’s Data” shall mean all documents, reports, data, records, forms, and other materials obtained by Vendor from Named Entity or is otherwise received by Vendor as a result of providing the Participating Entity Services as required under this Contract or any of the Incorporated Documents, without regard to whether such data includes the type of information included in the definition of Named Entity Protected Data.

(f) “Security Breach” means (i) any act or omission that materially compromises either the security, confidentiality or integrity of Named Entity Protected Data, or the physical, technical, administrative or organizational safeguards put in place by Vendor or any Authorized Persons that relate to the protection of the security, confidentiality or integrity of Named Entity Protected Data, (ii) receipt of a complaint in relation to the privacy practices of Vendor or any Authorized Persons or a breach or alleged breach of this Contract relating to such privacy practices.

(g) “Sensitive Personal Information” shall have the meaning set forth in Texas Business and Commerce Code §521.002(a)(2).

9.2 Standard of Care. (a) Vendor acknowledges and agrees that, during the course of its engagement by Named Entity, Vendor may receive or have access to Named Entity Protected Data. Vendor shall comply with the terms and conditions set forth in this Contract, the RFO, and OAG Information Security Standards (Attachment 4 to the RFO) in its collection, receipt, transmission, storage, disposal, use and disclosure of both Named Entity Protected Data and be responsible for the unauthorized collection, receipt, transmission, access, storage, disposal, use and disclosure of Named Entity Protected Data under its control or in its possession by all Authorized Employees and/or Authorized Persons. Vendor shall be responsible for and remain liable to Named Entity for the actions and omissions of all Authorized Persons that are not Authorized Employees

concerning the treatment of Named Entity Protected Data as if they were Vendor's own actions and omissions.

- (b) In recognition of the foregoing, Vendor agrees and covenants that it shall:
 - (i) keep and maintain all Named Entity Protected Data in strict confidence, using such degree of care as is appropriate to avoid unauthorized access, use or disclosure;
 - (ii) use and disclose Named Entity Protected Data solely and exclusively for the purposes for which the Named Entity Protected Data, or access to it, is provided pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Contract, and not use, sell, rent, transfer, distribute, or otherwise disclose or make available Named Entity Protected Data for Vendor's own purposes or for the benefit of anyone other than the OAG or Named Entity in each case, without Named Entity's prior written consent or as permitted in subsection (c) below; and
 - (iii) not, directly or indirectly, disclose Named Entity Protected Data to any person or entity other than its Authorized Employees and/or Authorized Persons ("Unauthorized Third Party") without the prior express written consent from Named Entity, unless and to the extent required by applicable law or court order in which case, Vendor shall (1) use best efforts to notify OAG before such disclosure or as soon thereafter as reasonably possible; (2) be responsible for and remain liable to OAG for the actions and omissions of any Unauthorized Third Party concerning the treatment of such Named Entity Protected Data as if they were Vendor's own actions and omissions; and (3) require the Unauthorized Third Party that has access to Personal Information to execute a written agreement agreeing to comply with the terms and conditions of this Contract, the RFO, and the OAG Information Security Standards (Attachment 4 to the RFO) relating to the treatment of Named Entity Protected Data.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing subsection (b), Vendor is authorized by Named Entity to utilize Named Entity Protected Data only to the extent such Named Entity Protected Data is related to a Defendant or to a Defendant Status Change (hereinafter "SAVNS Defendant Data") for the limited purpose of providing or improving Vendor's own existing products and services identified in the Appriss Data Overview to Law Enforcement Agencies and Government Agencies. For the purposes of this paragraph, "utilize" includes, but is not limited to, receiving, maintaining, disseminating, retaining, or otherwise providing access to any information obtained or extrapolated from SAVNS Defendant data obtained under the SAVNS program. "Government Agency" means an organization created by or pursuant to the Constitution of the United States or the constitution of a state of the United States and operated for public purposes. The term "Government Agency" shall not include any quasi-governmental entity or government-sponsored enterprise or corporation. "Law Enforcement Agency" means a Government Agency or an organizational unit within a Government Agency with authority to enforce state or federal criminal laws, which includes, but is not limited to, prevention, detection, and investigation of crime, and the apprehension and incarceration of alleged offenders;
- (d) Nothing in this Section 9.2 shall be construed to limit Vendor's use of non-confidential data made available to the public or otherwise in the public domain.

9.3 Information Security. (a) Vendor represents and warrants that its collection, access, use, storage, disposal and disclosure of Named Entity Protected Data does and will comply with all applicable federal, state, and local privacy and data protection laws, as well as all other applicable regulations and directives, including but not limited to Texas Business and Commerce Code Chapter 521, Texas Administrative Code Chapter 202 and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability of 1996 (HIPAA) and all amendments thereto.

- (b) Without limiting Vendor's obligations under Section 9.3(a) above, Vendor shall implement

administrative, physical and technical safeguards to protect Named Entity Protected Data. Vendor shall, upon request, submit to Named Entity security framework implemented in Vendor's organization, such as International Organization for Standardization's standards: ISO/IEC 27001:2013, Code of Practice for International Security Management, the Information Technology Library (ITIL) standards, the Control Objectives for Information and related Technology (COBIT) standards or other applicable industry standards for information security, and shall ensure that all such safeguards, including the manner in which Named Entity Protected Data is collected, accessed, used, stored, processed, disposed of and disclosed are in compliance with and in addition to the OAG Information Security Standards (Attachment 4 to the RFO).

(c) In addition to and inclusive of the requirements set forth in OAG Information Security Standards (Attachment 4 to the RFO), at a minimum, Vendor's safeguards for the protection of Named Entity Protected Data shall include: (i) limiting access of Named Entity Protected Data to Authorized Employees/Authorized Persons; (ii) securing business facilities, data centers, paper files, servers, back-up systems and computing equipment, including, but not limited to, all mobile devices and other equipment with information storage capability; (iii) implementing network, device application, database and platform security; (iv) securing information transmission, storage and disposal; (v) implementing authentication and access controls within media, applications, operating systems and equipment; (vi) encrypting Sensitive Personal Information stored on any mobile media; (vii) encrypting Sensitive Personal Information transmitted over public or wireless networks; (viii) strictly segregating Named Entity Protected Data, and information from its other customers so that Named Entity Protected Data is not commingled with any other types of information; (ix) implementing appropriate personnel security and integrity procedures and practices, including, but not limited to, conducting background checks consistent with any applicable state or federal law; and (x) providing appropriate privacy and information security training to Vendor's employees, contractors, or agents.

(d) During the term of each Authorized Employee's employment by Vendor, Vendor shall at all times cause such Authorized Employees to abide strictly by Vendor's obligations under this Contract, the RFO, and the OAG Information Security Standards (Attachment 4 to the RFO). Upon Named Entity's written request, Vendor shall promptly identify for Named Entity in writing all Authorized Employees as of the date of such request.

9.4 Security Breach Procedures.

(a) Vendor shall:

- (i) provide Named Entity with the name and contact information for an employee of Vendor who shall serve as Named Entity's primary security contact and shall be available to assist Named Entity twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week as a contact in resolving obligations associated with a Security Breach;
- (ii) notify Named Entity of a Security Breach as soon as practicable, but no later than twenty-four (24) hours after Vendor becomes aware of it; and
- (iii) notify Named Entity of any Security Breaches by telephone at the following number: [REDACTED] and by e-mailing Named Entity with a read receipt at [REDACTED] and with a copy by e-mail to Vendor's primary business contact within Named Entity.

(b) Immediately following Vendor's notification to Named Entity of a Security Breach, the parties shall coordinate with each other to investigate the Security Breach. Vendor agrees to reasonably cooperate with Named Entity in Named Entity's handling of the matter, including, without limitation:

- (i) assisting with any investigation;
- (ii) providing Named Entity with physical access to the facilities and operations affected;
- (iii) facilitating interviews with Vendor's employees and others involved in the matter; and
- (iv) making available all relevant records, logs, files, data reporting and other materials required to comply with applicable law, regulation, industry standards, this Contract, the RFO, and the OAG Information Security Standards (Attachment 4 to the RFO) or

as otherwise reasonably required by Named Entity.

(c) Vendor shall use best efforts to immediately remedy any Security Breach and prevent any further Security Breach at Vendor's expense in accordance with applicable privacy rights, laws, regulations and standards. Vendor shall reimburse Named Entity for actual costs incurred by Named Entity in responding to, and mitigating damages caused by, any Security Breach, including all costs of notice and/or remediation pursuant to Section 9.4(d).

(d) Vendor agrees that it shall not inform any third party of any Security Breach without first obtaining Named Entity's prior written consent, except to the extent required under Texas Business and Commerce Code Chapter 521 or any other applicable law, or as is otherwise required by the OAG under the OAG Certification Contract. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Vendor shall provide prior written notice to Named Entity of its intent to inform any third-party other than the OAG of any Security Breach and identify the applicable law the Vendor believes requires such disclosure.

(e) In the event of any Security Breach, Vendor shall promptly use its best efforts to prevent a recurrence of any such Security Breach.

9.5 Oversight of Security Compliance. Upon Named Entity's written request, to confirm compliance with this Contract, the RFO, the OAG Information Security Standards (Attachment 4 to the RFO) as well as any applicable laws and industry standards, Vendor shall promptly and accurately complete a written information security questionnaire provided by Named Entity or a third party on the Named Entity's behalf regarding Vendor's business practices and information technology environment in relation to all Named Entity Protected Data being handled and/or services being provided by Vendor to Named Entity or any of the Participating Entities pursuant to this Contract or the Incorporated Documents. Vendor shall fully cooperate with such inquiries. Named Entity shall treat the information provided by Vendor in the security questionnaire as Vendor's confidential, proprietary information under Section 10.1 below.

9.6 Return or Destruction of Named Entity Protected Data. At any time during the term of this Contract at the Named Entity's written request or upon the termination or expiration of this Contract for any reason, Vendor shall, and shall instruct all Authorized Persons to, promptly return to the Named Entity all copies, whether in written, electronic or other form or media, of Named Entity in its possession or the possession of such Authorized Persons, or securely dispose of all such copies, and certify in writing to the Named Entity that such Named Entity Protected Data has been returned to Named Entity or disposed of securely. Vendor shall comply with all reasonable directions provided by Named Entity with respect to the return or disposal of Named Entity Protected Data.

9.7 Equitable Relief. Vendor acknowledges that any material breach of its covenants or obligations set forth in this Section 9 may cause Named Entity irreparable harm for which monetary damages may not be adequate compensation and agrees that, in the event of such breach or threatened breach, Named Entity may be entitled to seek equitable relief, including a restraining order, injunctive relief, specific performance and any other relief that may be available from any court, in addition to any other remedy to which Named Entity may be entitled at law or in equity. Such remedies shall not be deemed to be exclusive but shall be in addition to all other remedies available at law or in equity, subject to any express exclusions or limitations in this Contract to the contrary.

9.8 Material Breach. Vendor's failure to comply with any of the provisions of this Section 9 is a material breach of this Contract. In such event, Named Entity may terminate the Contract for cause, effective immediately upon written notice to the Vendor without further liability or obligation to Named Entity. This immediate termination for cause shall be in addition to any rights to termination contemplated under Section 11.2(a) below and shall not be subject to any written notice or cure period required therein.

9.9 Indemnification. In addition to any of the other indemnification or hold harmless obligations of Vendor

provided for within this Contract, the RFO or the OAG's Standard Terms and Conditions, Vendor shall also defend, indemnify and hold harmless the State of Texas and OAG, the Named Entity and/or their officers, agents, employees, representatives, contractors, assignees, and/or designees (collectively the "Named Entity Indemnitees") from and against all losses, damages, deficiencies, actions, judgments, interest, awards, penalties, fines, reasonable costs or expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, the cost of enforcing any right to indemnification hereunder and the cost of pursuing any insurance providers, arising out of or resulting from any third party claim against any Named Entity Indemnitee arising out of or resulting from Vendor's failure to comply with any of its obligations under this Section 9.

9.10 Ownership and Use of Named Entity's Data. Notwithstanding anything in this Contract to the contrary, nothing contained herein shall be construed to grant the Vendor any ownership rights in any Named Entity's data provided to Vendor in connection with this Contract, the SOW, or any of the Incorporated Documents. With the exception of information in the public domain, Vendor shall not sell, provide, or otherwise commercialize Named Entity's Data without the prior written consent of Named Entity. Vendor shall only use the Named Entity's Data in connection with the Participating Entity Services required hereunder and otherwise consistent with this Contract and the Incorporated Documents.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Vendor is authorized by Named Entity to utilize Named Entity Data only to the extent such Named Entity Data is related to a Defendant or to a Defendant Status Change (hereinafter "SAVNS Defendant Data") for the limited purpose of providing or improving Vendor's own existing products and services identified in the Appriss Data Overview to Law Enforcement Agencies and Government Agencies as attached to the Special Provisions. For the purposes of this paragraph, "utilize" includes, but is not limited to, receiving, maintaining, disseminating, retaining, or otherwise providing access to any information obtained or extrapolated from SAVNS Defendant data obtained under the SAVNS program. "Government Agency" means an organization created by or pursuant to the Constitution of the United States or the constitution of a state of the United States and operated for public purposes. The term "Government Agency" shall not include any quasi-governmental entity or government-sponsored enterprise or corporation. "Law Enforcement Agency" means a Government Agency or an organizational unit within a Government Agency with authority to enforce state or federal criminal laws, which includes, but is not limited to, prevention, detection, and investigation of crime, and the apprehension and incarceration of alleged offenders.

SECTION 10: CONFIDENTIALITY

10.1 Named Entity's Responsibilities. Named Entity hereby agrees that (i) specific identified methodologies, materials, plans, or other proprietary information related to the development and implementation of the SAVNS system as provided by Vendor under this Contract shall be treated as confidential in nature and shall be subject to the various ownership provision of the Incorporated Documents; (ii) Named Entity shall implement reasonable and appropriate measures designed to secure the confidentiality of such confidential information, and (iii) except as permitted by the SOW and Section 10.2 of this Contract, none of such materials shall be in any way disclosed by Named Entity to any third party, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of Vendor. If Named Entity becomes aware of the unauthorized possession of such materials, it shall promptly notify Vendor. Notwithstanding anything in this Contract to the contrary, any report, plan, or other deliverable required to be provided to Named Entity pursuant to the Incorporated Documents shall not be considered to be confidential in nature and Named Entity is under no obligation to maintain the confidentiality thereof.

10.2 Named Entity Compliance and Vendor Cooperation with Texas Public Information Act Requests. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Contract to the contrary, Vendor understands that Named Entity will comply with the Texas Public Information Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 552 as interpreted by judicial opinions and opinions of the Attorney General of the State of Texas. Named Entity agrees to notify Vendor in writing within a reasonable time, of a request for information related to Vendor's work under this Contract. Vendor will cooperate with Named Entity in the production of documents responsive to the request. Named Entity will make a determination whether to submit a request for a ruling to withhold documents to the Attorney General. Vendor will notify Named Entity General Counsel within twenty-four (24) hours of receipt of any

third-party requests for information that was provided by the State of Texas for use in performing this Contract and all data and other information generated or otherwise. Vendor is required to make any information created or exchanged with Named Entity, the State of Texas, or any of its agencies pursuant to this Contract, and not otherwise excepted from disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act, available in a format that is accessible by the public at no additional charge to the state.

10.3 Vendor's Responsibilities. Vendor hereby agrees that (i) any information related to the official business of Named Entity that Vendor obtains from Named Entity in the course of the performance of this Contract is the confidential and proprietary information of Named Entity, (ii) Vendor shall implement reasonable and appropriate measures designed to secure the confidentiality of such information, and (iii) such information shall not be in any way disclosed by Vendor to any third party, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of Named Entity, which may be granted or withheld in its sole discretion. If Vendor becomes aware of the unauthorized possession of such information, it shall promptly notify Named Entity. Vendor shall also assist Named Entity with preventing the recurrence of such unauthorized possession and with any litigation against the third parties deemed necessary by Named Entity to protect its proprietary rights.

10.4 Exclusions. Each party shall be a receiving party ("Receiving Party") relative to the other party's confidential information. The provisions of this Section 10 ("Confidentiality") shall not apply to any information (i) that is in the public domain prior to the disclosure or that becomes part of the public domain, or otherwise becomes publicly known, by publication or otherwise, other than by way of a breach of this Contract by the Receiving Party, (ii) that was known to, or in the lawful possession of the Receiving Party without obligation, as the case may be, prior to the disclosure in connection with the Contract, (iii) that was disclosed to the Receiving Party by a third party who was in lawful possession of the information and who had the right to make such disclosure at the time of the disclosure, (iv) that was independently developed by the Receiving Party outside the scope of this Contract, or (v) that Receiving Party, is required to disclose by law or legal process, in which case Receiving Party shall notify the owning party so that action may be taken to protect the affected confidential information. Notwithstanding any other provision herein to the contrary, all provisions in this Section 10 are subject to the Public Information Act, as further described in the Contract. Further, nothing in this Section 10.4 shall be deemed to alter, limit, or otherwise modify any of Vendor's obligations related to the use and protection of Named Entity Protected Data pursuant to Section 9 of this Contract, the RFO, and OAG Information Security Standards (Attachment 4 to the RFO).

SECTION 11: TERMINATION

11.1 Termination by Vendor. Vendor may terminate this Contract if Named Entity commits any material breach under this Contract and fails to remedy such breach within (30) days after written notice of such breach is delivered by Vendor to Named Entity.

11.2 Termination by Named Entity.

(a) *For Cause.* Named Entity shall have the right to terminate this Contract (reserving cumulatively all other rights and remedies under this Contract, the RFO, and the Incorporated Documents, in law and/or in equity) without further obligation or liability to Vendor if Vendor or any subcontractor to Vendor commits any material breach of this Contract and fails to remedy such breach within thirty (30) days after written notice by Named Entity to Vendor of such breach. Named Entity shall have the right to terminate this Contract effective immediately and without prior notice if Vendor goes into liquidation or files for bankruptcy.

(b) *Non-appropriations.* Named Entity may terminate this Contract if funds sufficient to pay its obligations under the Contract are not appropriated: i) by the governing body on behalf of local governments; ii) by the Texas legislature on behalf of the OAG; or iii) by budget execution authority provisioned to the Governor or the Legislative Budget Board as provided in Chapter 317, Texas Government Code. In the event of non-appropriation, Vendor will be provided ten (10) calendar days written notice of intent to terminate. In the event of such termination, the Named Entity will not be considered to be in default or breach under this Contract, nor shall Named Entity be liable for any further payments ordinarily due under this Contract, nor shall it be liable for any damages or any other amounts which are caused by or associated with such termination.

(c) *For convenience.* Notwithstanding the foregoing or anything in this Contract or the

Incorporated Documents to the contrary, Named Entity reserves the right to terminate the Contract at any time, in whole or in part, without penalty, by providing thirty (30) calendar days advance written notice to the Vendor, subject to the advance written approval of such termination by the OAG or in the event OAG determines that such termination is in its best interest or the best interest of the State of Texas or the Named Entity. In the event of such a notice of termination, Vendor shall, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon in writing, cease all work immediately. Named Entity shall be liable for payments limited only to the portion of work Named Entity authorized in writing and which the Vendor has completed, delivered to Named Entity per the Contract requirements, and which has been accepted by Named Entity as of the date of termination. Named Entity shall have no other liability or obligation to Vendor, including, without limitation, no liability for any costs of any kind associated with the termination.

11.3 Effect of Termination. Termination of this Contract shall not affect any rights and/or obligations of the parties which arose prior to any such termination and such rights and/or obligations shall survive any such termination. Upon termination, each party shall return the confidential property of the other party obtained under this Contract or the Incorporated Documents, as applicable, however excluding all Work Product as that is defined in OAG Standard Terms and Conditions, Article I, Definitions, produced pursuant to this Contract which shall remain the property of Named Entity. In addition, the confidentiality obligations of the parties in Section 10 (“Confidentiality”) shall survive the termination of this Contract.

SECTION 12: LIMITATIONS ON LIABILITY AND INDEMNITIES

12.1 Limitation of Liability. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS CONTRACT, NEITHER PARTY SHALL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER FOR ANY INDIRECT, SPECIAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES OR LOSS OF ANTICIPATED PROFITS OR REVENUES IN CONNECTION WITH OR ARISING OUT OF THE SUBJECT MATTER OF THIS CONTRACT.

12.2 Indemnification. In addition to the indemnification and hold harmless obligations of Vendor in this Contract included in Section 8.2 and Section 9.9 above, Vendor shall:
