TDCJ overview:

The Texas Department of Criminal Justice regrets to inform you of the deaths of 2 offenders likely connected to the coronavirus.

62-year-old Miguel Arciba died May 3, 2020 after being in the intensive care unit of Hospital Galveston for over a week. Arciba was taken to a local hospital from the Telford Unit in New Boston on April 13th, suffering from shortness of breath and COVID-19 possible symptoms. He suffered from a number of preexisting conditions and did test positive for the virus. Arciba had served 13 years of a Life sentence out of Ellis County. The results of preliminary autopsy suggest COVID-19 as a contributing cause of death.

Gerald Barragan died May 5, 2020 at Hospital Galveston he was 62 years old. Barragan suffered from a number of pre-existing medical conditions. He was transported from the Terrell Unit to Hospital Galveston on April 26th suffering from possible COVID-19 symptoms. Barragan has served 11 months of a 5 year sentence out of Kendall County. Barragan's family declined an autopsy but the presumed cause of death is COVID-19 pneumonia.

There are an additional 16 deaths that are under investigation and pending preliminary autopsy results.

In total there are 535 TDCJ employees, staff or contractors who have tested positive for COVID-19 and 1379 offenders who have tested positive. There are now 80 employees and 371 offenders who have medically recovered from COVID-19.

21,595 offenders are on medical restriction because they may have had contact with either an employee or offender with a positive or pending COVID-19 test.

PRECAUTIONARY LOCKDOWN 44,441 offenders impacted.

Governor Abbott Modifies COVID-19 Executive Orders To Eliminate Confinement As A Punishment

AUSTIN - Governor Greg Abbott today modified his executive orders related to COVID-19 to eliminate confinement as a punishment for violating these orders. These modifications are being applied retroactively.

“Throwing Texans in jail who have had their businesses shut down through no fault of their own is nonsensical, and I will not allow it to happen,” said Governor Abbott. “That is why I am modifying my executive orders to ensure confinement is not a punishment for violating an order. This order is retroactive to April 2nd, supersedes local orders and if correctly applied should free Shelley Luther. It may also ensure that other Texans like Ana Isabel Castro-Garcia and Brenda Stephanie Mata who were arrested in Laredo, should not be subject to confinement. As some county judges advocate for releasing hardened criminals from jail to prevent the spread of COVID-19, it is absurd to have these business owners take their place.”
